

Ended Chancery File No 9.
Copy of the Will of David Whitlock.

The name of God Amen.

David Whitlock of the County of Hanover & parish of Saint Paul
being of sound mind & memory do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit.
That my will and desire that all my just and lawful debts be paid
before that purpose I desire that my Executors may sell a tract
of land that I have in the State of Kentucky, which I pur-
chased of my son Samuel Whitlock, & adopt such other methods for
the payment of the same as they shall think best.

I give and bequeath unto my sons Charles Whitlock, Luther
Richardson Whitlock, and David Prich Whitlock all the land that I
am entitled to in the County of Randolph (State of Virginia) to be
equally divided between them, to them and their heirs forever.
I give unto my wife Martha Whitlock the tract of land whereon I now

I and unto my Wife Martha Whitlock the tract of land ~~known~~ I now
have during her Widowhood and at her death or marriage it is my
will and desire that the said tract of land to be equally divided
between my two daughters - Rebekah, Doran Whitlock and Lucy
Ann Whitlock to them and their heirs forever, but in case either of my
said daughters should die under age or unmarried it is my will
that the surviving one have the whole of the said land. I likewise
bequeath unto my Wife Martha Whitlock during her natural life all
the rest of my estate of every kind and quality whatsoever & at her
death to be divided between my following children as they shall
die to-wit: Charles Whitlock Junr, Richardson Whitlock, David
Clark Whitlock, Rebekah, Doran, Whitlock & Lucy Ann Whitlock
to them and their heirs forever.

And lastly I nominate and appoint my wife Martha Whitlock and John
Richardson Executors and Executors to have my last will
and Testament in Witness Whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and affixed my seal this 28th day of March
1814 at 11 o'clock A.M. Doran Whitlock & sister
