A copy of the Will of Henry Spinelle.

In the name of God Amen.
I Henry Spinelle, do make and ordain that my last will and testament in witness and soon following to wit. I first will and desire that all my just and funeral expenses be paid by my Executrix afterward named.

And I give and bequeath to my grand daughter, Sally Perkins Gaines, when she attains the age of eighteen years or shall marry, my Negroes, Pictorial books, and six hundred dollars, provided my daughter shall be disposed that she shall receive this Legacy. At that time, should she not be thus disposed. I wish her to retain the said Legacy so long as she lives, and at her death, I then give the same to my Grand daughter, Sally H. Gaines to her and her heirs forever, all the debt and residue of my estate both real and personal.

And I give and bequeath to my grand daughter, Sally Perkins
Gaines, when she attains the age of eighteen years or there-
abouts, my negroes, Rebecca Cook, and six hundred
dollars, provided my daughter shall be disposed that she
shall receive this legacy. At that time, should she not be thus
disposed, I wish her to retain the said legacy so long as
she lives, and at her death, I then give the same to my Grand
daughter, Sally G. Gaines to her and her heirs forever, all
the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal.

I give to my beloved daughter, E. Gaines for and during
her natural life, and at her death the said same to all
my children who may survive her and to the survivors of
them, as may have lived before her to them and their
heirs forever.

I nominate, and appoint my Son in Law
Wm. F. Gaines my Executor this my last will

and and Testament. In Testimony Whereof, I have set
my hand, and affixed my seal this 28th day of Dec 1833

of the said, W. F. Ginn, a Certificate was granted him in order to
his obtaining probat of the said Will and Testament in due form
and law, he having first taken the oath in such case
required by law and entered into a bond payable to the
sitting justices in the penalty of Twenty thousand dollars
with, Wm M. Gary and Lawrence Pearson his Sureties
which said bond being conditioned as the law directs
was acknowledged by the obligors and also ordered
to be recorded.

The nominal Executor Thuermer was favored by the oaths of Richard
Perogis and Dorcas Spindle two of the Subscribing Witnesses
To the same and ordered to be recorded. Whereupon, on the motion
of the said, W. F. Gains, a Certificate, was granted him in order to
his obtaining probat of the said Will and Testament in due form
and law, he having first taken the oath in such case
required by law and entered into a bond payable to the
Sitting justices on the penalty of Twenty thousand dollars
with, Wm M. Gary and Isaac James Reams his Sureties
which said bond being conditioned, as the law directs
was acknowledged, by the obligors and also ordered
to be recorded.
