Copy of the Will of Harmon P. Glenn

I Harmon P. Glenn of the County of Henrico & State of Virginia do hereby make this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say:

First I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall be first paid from the sale of a mare & Colt and two Cows and a small piece of land containing about thirty three acres and adjoining the lands of W. V. D. Campbell, Leroy A. Cornshaw & others which I trust my Executors & Executor to sell immediately upon my decease and any balance from this sale I want appropriated as herein after directed. I direct that the tract of land, I now live on containing about 115 acres all the crops, two Cows one horse, one mare, Hogs, farming implements, household & kitchen furniture all of my negroes and all the crops of what kind soever in my possession at the time of my decease may be allowed to remain

possession at the time of my decease may be allowed to remain  
in the quiet use and occupancy of my wife Lucy, H. her natural life or until my  
youngest child John, H. shall become of age (21 years) with the exception of one  
feather Bedstead and furniture which I direct shall be given my daughter  
Carmelita immediately upon her marriage should such an event happen before  
the death of my said wife Lucy, H. and at the death of my said wife or my said  
youngest son John, H. arriving of age the property above named and any increase  
thereof as well also as any other property I may die seized and possessed of  
shall be sold and equally divided between my children or their lawful  
representatives.

I direct my Executor & Esq. to lend out the amount of money  
I shall receive from my brother Nathaniel Stearns Estate which will be  
some \$500. The interest on which is to be collected semiannually  
and appropriated to the schooling of my son Herman, H. Stearns  
four years from this date and then the \$500. to be equally divided  
between my children Wm, H. Peter D. Carmelita  
Helen, H. Frances A. E. & John, H.

Thirdly, I direct my Executors & Admrs to lend out the amount of money I shall receive from my brother Nathaniel Stearns Estate which will be some \$500. The interest on which is to be collected semiannually and appropriated to the schooling of my son Herman, Jr. Stearns for 7 years from this date and then the \$500 to be equally divided between my children w<sup>ms</sup>, P<sup>r</sup>. Peter D. Stearns, P<sup>r</sup>. Francis A. Co. & John, Jr.

Fourthly, If my wife finds at any time, that it is

my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills
