

I. Also in these my manners and forms following make my last will and testament.

Also I wish all my just debts to be paid from any money I may leave in bonds and from the proceeds of the sale of any part of my personal estate not mentioned in bequest herein after made which may be left over for that purpose and I leave all my personal estate left after the payment of my just debts and not mentioned in bequests hereinafter made during my life to my wife Jane.

After the payment of my just debts should there remain more of my payable estate than my wife Jane should want to keep and have care for it, it my wish that the slaves be sold and the proceeds of the sale thereof be equally divided between my wife Jane and my daughters Alice and Maria. I lend to my wife Jane the plantation in which I now reside called Dennis during her life to gather with that part of the parcel or tract of land purchased of James E. Jones about six or seven acres situated and lying on the east side of the creek conveying the stream of water from the deep branch to Totopotomoy Creek.

Item. I lend to my wife Jane during her life the following Slaves namely Benwell, Andrew, David, Alberta, James, Patrick, Bully, to name Margaret Lydia and Abby. I lend to my wife Jane the said plantation and the said slaves after upon the condition that she remains my widow as long as she may live I also lend her the value of my negro servant William that was killed by the Indians in case any value in amount of money is ever recovered by the County Wills Book 1867-1868

the condition that she remain my widow as long as she may live or the
event that she marry again I give the whole of the real and personal estate
left to her during life to my children Alice and State to be between them
equally divided ~~and~~ ^{as} equally after her marriage.

Item. After the death of my wife Jane I give to my children Alice and State
the whole of my said Real and personal estate to equally divided between them
Item. I give to my children Alice and State the following slaves namely
John, John George Wilson, David Winston and my negro woman Peppie
and her four children Philip, Sally, Molly and Henrietta and her future
increase to be uninvolved and Stephen for their fruits and equal benefit
until one or the other of them marry or attain to the age of twenty one years
Item. I give my daughter Alice my negro woman Caroline and her child
together with her future increase one feather bed bedstead bolster
two pillows bolster case two pillow cases two blankets and one
comfort or counterpane.

Item. I give to my daughter State my girls Lydia daughter of negro woman
Abby together with said negro girl Lydia's future increase and one
feather bed bedstead bolster two pillows bolster case two pillow cases
two sheets two blankets and one comfort or counterpane.

Item. I give to my two daughters Alice and State the whole of my piano
which is all of it always purchased by me of the Executive Importer under the
name of J. L. Lovell & Co.

Item. I give to my daughters Alice and State the following books to be divided
between them all of that people to each other.

James River and lying on the west side of the estate containing
acres the stream of water from the deep branch to top of long creek
which runs through said branch and lying at the north east corner
extending from Mechanicsville Turnpike road containing nine and
a half acres which tract I purchased of William Hutchinson.
that part of land which I purchased of Captain and adjoining
land of the estate of Sam Crossfield and including all manner containing
three acres and that tract a parcel of land which I purchased of Dr
Charles R. Collier, adjoining the west line of Dr John G. Simpler and
containing five acres more or less.

Item. In the event of either one of my children by my wife dying
before marrying or attaining to the age of twenty one years the portion of
of the child so dying shall go to the surviving child by my wife alone.
Item. To my daughter Margaret Turner I have given Negro woman Celia
and her oldest child Linda and Negro woman Charlotte and all
her children which gift is confirmed and hereby made a bequest
the said Negro has been delivered into my daughter Margaret Turner
possession.

Item. To my daughter Virginia Johnson I have given Negro woman
Lucy, Negro woman Celiza and all her children namely, Harris or
Nick, Agnes, Lucy and Celiza which gift is confirmed and hereby
made a bequest the said Negro has been delivered into my daugh-
ter Virginia Johnson possession.

Item. I appoint my friend George S. Butler to administer this my

Made a bequest—the said bequest has been delivered into my charge
to Virginia Johnson for safe keeping.

Item. I appoint my friend George S. Bailey Executor of this my
last will and testament and wish that he may receive of him
no security for his faithful execution thereof. witness my
signature and seal on this the 1st day of November 1864
