make and ordain This my last will and testament in the
presence and form following (that is to say) I purpoise I
desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be first
paid. I give to my Son William Blum the sixty three
acres of land which he was put in possession of by his
Father also I give or confirm a title to thirty eight acres more
land which he had purchased of his Father John Blum
in his life time, and which he has never had a deed for the same
fully executed, also I give him the following negroes to wit
Fanny, Matt, William, Susan, John, Martha and her
two children William and Cherry with full power to him
and his heirs forever.

I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of June
1854. In presence of the following witnesses

of said Infirmities. I give to my Son William Blinn the sixty three
acres of land which he was first in possession of by his
Father also I give or confirm a title to thirty eight acres more

fully executed, also I give him the following negroes to wit
Fanny, Matt, William, Owen, John, Martha and her
two children, William and Mary with future increase to them
and their heirs forever. I give to my Son John Blinn the thirty acres
of land which he was first in possession of by his
Father also I give or confirm a title to thirty eight acres more
land which he had purchased of his Father John Blinn
in his life time, and which he has never had a deed for the same
fully executed, also I give him the following negroes to wit
Fanny, Matt, William, Owen, John, Martha and her
two children, William and Mary with future increase to them
and their heirs forever.

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I Elmon, do hereby give three acres of land to include the buildings
where I now live and Spring of water during his natural life, should
he depart this life and leave no lawful heir after managing in
that case I desire the said three acres of land given him to be
equally divided between my two sons William Elmon and
John Elmon and their heirs forever and also the sum of my
that be, also I give to my son James R. Elmon the following Negroes
to wit: Elisha, Mary, Maccoring, Peter, Malley and Wintney with
their future increase to him and his heirs forever. Also I give
him one yoke of oxen, one cow and calf one feather
bed and bedstead two figured, counterpane three bed quilts
one pair of sheets and all tables, chests, benches and forks pector
cathorn ware that I may possess at the time of my death
Impressies I give to my Executors herein after named for the benefit
of my Grand Children the Children of my son Archibald Elmon the
said three acres of land which is to be at the direction of my Exors
during their minority but when they shall arrive at lawful age

among their minority but when they shall come at lawful age
agree it to be equally divided amongst them. Also I had
given to my son Archibald H. Brown in his life time the
following Negroes to wit, Gordon, Buzza, Henry, Lucy, Charles
Belly, to which said Negroes and their future increase I
have no claim whatever, he having them during his life
imprisoned. It is my desire that if upon survey of the whole
tract of land it should be found contain more than the half
those acres as devised to each legatee together with the forty
eight acres sold by my brother and John Brown to his son William
Brown as before mentioned that the said tract shall be divided into
equal part of such number of acres as may be found to be the
whole and the same to be divided equally amongst the said legatee

with which I have by my Executors to the payment of the just debts
which I may owe at the time of my death, that it is my will that my
said Executors, negroes Sam and Watson and annually apply
sums which may be raised by their sale to the payment of
said debts: but if my creditors will not wait to be thus paid
said Executors are hereby directed to sell my said negroes ~~more~~
at private sale and that they may charge his master provided
they may give a fair price for him and apply the money thus obtained
to the payment of my said debts, should these funds prove
insufficient for the payment of the said debts my Executors are hereby
directed to sell my said negroes ~~Sam~~ Watson at private sale or as
directed above for Sam. Thomas William Brown and John Brown
formerly became bound for Michael To them as security
for a debt whatever amount it may be it is my desire that
they shall be reimbursed from the proceeds of the sale of said negroes
above named. It is also my desire after all my just debts
are paid that my Executors shall raise, from the time or date of the

that my Executors shall raise, from the time or sale of the
said married negroes two hundred dollars for the support
of my grand children. The children of Archibald M. Glenn and
be applied by my said executors at their discretion for the support of
said children.

Also I give to my son William Glenn after all my
debts herefore mentioned be raised and all my debts herefore
mentioned are discharged my negro man Watson to him and his
heirs forever. Also I give to my son John T. Glenn after all my
debts herefore named are discharged my negro man Sam to
him and his heirs forever.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son William Glenn and
John T. Glenn Executors to this my last will and testament hereby
revoking all others. Will is made and signed at Trenton
New Jersey the 10th day of June 1854.
