Copy of the Will of John Anderson.

In the name of God Amen.

I John Anderson of Ramsey County (Taylor's Creek) being in perfect
alth & sound memory of mind yet considering the brevity of this
earthly & transitory life the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the
time do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in words
and form following.

I give my Soul to God that gave it: Hoping through
merits of my Redeemer, grace to receive full pardon for all
sins and sin. Blessed be God. Next I commit my body
the earth from whence it was taken in full assurance
its resurrection from thence. and as to my burial. I desire
it may be in the manner as my beloved Wife was and
my estate both real and personal I dispose of it in manner
form following.

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from following:

I desire that my estate be not appraised.

I give to Patsy A. Anderson (my natural daughter) hundred acres of land in Lawrence County to be laid the lower end of the land I purchased of Joseph Atkins also the following negroes viz Austin and one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf one horse beast and side saddle one bow and pig pot and pan. Six plates one dish & one basin half a ton of iron & forks three hundred weight of new pork ten barrels of corn to her and her heirs forever. Also land to her during her being in a single state the room being in the West end of my dwelling house for the hall and study also the use of all my other rooms also the use of one fourth part of the land and my orchards of every kind, also one dining table and two chairs also two cows and as the room

think proper to occupy for cultivation and pasture not exceeding one fourth of the inclosed land, with liberty to cut fire wood & timber for repairs on the land.

I also lend her the use of Shadricks during her being in a single state, but should she marry or die then my Will and desire is that Shadricks shall be at liberty & fully free in the same manner, that free born persons are. my further Will and desire is that if she should die leaving no child that the estate before given should return into my estate & be divided as hereafter mentioned, viz. Amongst all but should she & living child or children then the estate shall be heird by him or her or them as the case may be.

Item. I give to my Son John B. Anderson the land and plantation whereon I now live (not affecting the interest of Patsy A. Anderson herein before mentioned also the following negroes viz. Isaac, Francis & her servants and

having negroes viz: Packer, Fanning & her present and future increase. Together with one desk, one folding table and my coach to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give to my daughter Sally Pulliam fifty pounds current money to be raised out of my estate.

Item. I give to my daughter Susannah A. Harmon all my right and interest in the tract of land my son Harmon did possess of in South Carolina Union County, also my right and interest in the negro Woman Peggy and her present and future increase that was my son Harmon's, also five pounds current money of Virginia to be raised out of my estate.

Also. as to the rest of my estate, I give all the lands in Virginia not as yet disposed of to my son Harmon and property in Virginia to my daughter Sally Pulliam.

Witness my hand and seal this 10th day of March 1804.

Richardson's preparation & that proportion of my estate my
will and desire is that it shall remain with her and for her use
The direction of my Executors & after her decease to be equally
divided all her children.

hundred.
