Copy of the Will of John Anderson

In the name of God, Amen.

I John Anderson of Hennepin County (Stephen's brother) being in perfect
health & sound memory of mind yet Considering the brevity of this
short & troublous life the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the
time do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in these
words following:

James giving my soul to God that gave it: hoping through
merits of my Redeemer Jesus to receive full pardon for all
kinds errors. Blessed be God. Next I commit my body
to the earth from whence it was taken. I am full assured
of its resurrection from thence, and as to my burial. I desire
it may be in the manner as my beloved wife was laid
my estate both real and personal I dispose of it in manner
afore following.

from following:

I desire that my Estates be not appraised.
I give to Peter A. Anderson (my natural daughter)
hundred acres of land in Linn County, to be held
The land, and of the land I purchased of Joseph
Hens also the following negroes Diz Austin and
one female slave and fugitive one ox and pair
of horses bridle breast and side saddle one stool and pair
of boots and shoes two plates one dish & one basin - half
a pound of soap three hundred weight of new park
ten bushels of corn to her and her heirs forever.
No land to her during her being in a single state like
Arizona being in the interest of my dwelling house
the time and money and the rest of all my other
possessions in the year of our Lord of Right
and my estate of every kind else
I do tell and I do declare to

think proper to accept for cultivation and pasture not
exceeding one fourth of the enclosed land, with liberty for
to cut fire wood & timber for repairs on the land.

I also lend her the use of Shadrack during his being in
a single state, but should she marry or die him my
Will and desire it that Shadrack shall be at liberty & fully
free in his same manor, that first born persons over my
brother Will and desire is that if she should die leaving no
child that the estate before given should return into my
estate & be divided as hereafter mentioned, viz. Amongst all
but should she & living child or children then the estate
shall be divided by them or two of them as the case may
be.

Item. I give to my Son John B. Anderson the land and per-
tation wherein I now live (not affecting the entailed of
Peter & A. Anderson herein before mentioned) also the fol-
lowing negroes. His present slaves & last account as

loring negotiat^s, Mrs. Gacor. Having & held present and
future increase. Together with one duck, one folding table
and my couch to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Abby Gilligan \$500 pounds
Crown ~~sterling~~ to be paid out of my estate.

Item I give to my daughter Susannah A. Gilman all one
eighth undivided interest in the tract of land my late husband
died possessed of in both Carolina towns County also
one eighth undivided interest in the wife Union Reg and her power
and future income that was my late husband also five
pounds toward money of his debts to be paid out of my
estate.
