

I John B Jones of the City of Hanover & State of Va do make & ordain this my last will & testament

First I will that all my just debts funeral expenses be paid by my Executor as soon after my death as practicable.

Second I wish that my Executor shall collect all the debts due me whether by bond, accounts or otherwise as soon as practicable & pay it over to my daughter H. H. Isbell.

Third I will all my Stock of every kind, my plantation interests & also my household & kitchen furniture to my daughter H. H. Isbell. Fourth I will my home house & land on which I now live to my daughter Isbell on east side of the Road with the distinct reservation of my family grave yard (as used).

Fifth I will to my Grand daughter Emily F. Jones my land in Louisa called Rope Swamp of one hundred & twenty seven acres and also my land in Hanover adjoining the lands of Colleton & Sumner formerly belonging to my Sister Nancy, Mitchell & the land I formerly sold to David Sharp & supposed the two to be over one hundred acres more or less.

Sixth I will that my Mill in the South Anna River in Louisa shall be sold by my Executor at public sale with the land attached thereto & the money arising therefrom to be divided among my grand children. Seventh I will that all debts to be paid by me

among my grand Children.

Seventh and will to be paid to my daughter in law Mary E Jones
five hundred dollars by my Executor as soon as he can collect
it from my bonds.

Eighth I will that my Brick House tract of lands on which
Patrick I will now resides shall be sold & the money equally divid-
ed among all my grand Children.

And then I do hereby constitute & appoint my friend Dr George
Planning of Hanover Clk my Executor to carry out & execute this
my last & Testament: witness my hand & seal this 30 June 1867
