The Will of John Darnacott.

I John Darnacott of the County of Hampshire do make
this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all
others hitherto made by me.
I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary A.
Darnacott all my estate of every description to be held
by her for the ~~mutual~~ benefit of my wife and such of
her children as are now under the age twenty one
and the schooling of such of them as have not re-
ceived their education and for those purposes.
It is my wish that my wife, here and my executors
sell out any lands quit and saw mills or relations
therein in her possession so manage the said property
in such other way as she may think best and out of
the profits arising therefrom that she should apply the same

To the objects to the objects above specified.

It is my will and desire that in case of the marriage of any of my children or their coming at the age of twenty one years that my said wife should make such advancement to them as she makes think proper and that they be charged with the same and at a division of my estate at the death of my wife that they account therefor before they participate in any part of my estate.

It is my will and desire at the death of my wife that all my estate should be equally divided amongst all my children except to those to whom I have made advancement and those to whom my wife may hereafter make advancements in order therefore that justice may be done to such of my children as have not received an advancement. I hereby direct that in the division of my estate that Elizabeth C. Winston be charged with \$1000 & Francis the advanced value of a piece of land given her that my son William M. Weston & John

to be charged with one thousand three hundred and
sixty dollars advanced to him. That my Son Richard F.
Dunacott be charged with four hundred and thirty dollars
advanced to him and my Son advanced to him and my Son
George M. Dunacott be charged with two hundred and fifty
five dollars advanced to him which said advancements
each of my said last mentioned children are to account
for to my estate before they are at liberty to participate
in the division thereof.

I hereby appoint my said wife Mary A. Dunacott,
sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament and that
she may have complete power and authority to sell both
of my personal property as she may think best to pay
off all my just debts, and it is my wish in the management
of my estate that my wife should consult with my
friends Doct^r Joseph W. Shepard William D. Winston
and my two sons William Dunacott and Richard F.

Donacott, and it is my wish that my wife should not
give any security upon her qualification as my Executor.
