Copy of the Will of John Thornton

In the name of God Amen.  
I John Thornton of the County of New Hampshire make & ordain this as my last will and testament. Inasmuch as other Wills, made before made by me,  
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah  
Hall one negro girl named Hannah, during her natural  
and at her death to her daughter Sarah Hall to have  
and her heirs forever of whom so ever born daughter  
Sarah Hall one room in my dwelling house called  
the Mud Room with the piddidge of fire Woods & Water  
during her natural life. I also gave my said daughter  
Sarah Hall one hundred dollars to  
be paid annually by one million Thornton out of the  
1st and 2nd of every year.

I hereby declare I would desire all to know in this my  
Will:

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Catharine  
Junnun the intent of one thousand dollars to be paid  
immediately by my Executors hereafter to be made up  
at the death of my said daughter Catharine Junnum  
it is my Will and desire, that my Executors do equally  
divide this sum of one thousand dollars, between the  
two youngest children now in being of my said daughter  
Catharine Junnum, and in the event of either of the two  
said children dying before before the death of their  
mother, then the said thousand dollars to be equally  
divided between the remaining, and if at the time of  
this said division there shall be less than  
two children, then the same to be divided  
between the two children.

to be paid by son John Thawton yearly out of the twelve  
of which I have divided to him in this my will.

I give and bequeath unto my son John Thawton for two  
hundred and fifty acres of land called and known  
as the mess of Greenwich quarters and adjoining the land of  
John Price his land extended together to him & his heirs forever

I give and bequeath unto my son William Thawton  
properly I have before given it to him and in the event of my  
son Anthony Thawton death without lawful issue, it is my will

I desire that my said son William Thawton shall have the  
lot of land divided in like manner to my son Anthony Thawton  
and known by the name of Mill Creek and lying in the  
town of Newmarket.

I give and bequeath unto my son Anthony Thawton  
during his natural life one tract of land called and known by  
name of Mill Creek containing one thousand acres, to be the same  
or less, I also give him the tract of land on which I reside.

in 1800, I also gave him the tract of land on which I reside  
with the tract of land called Lawrence, the tract of  
the new road bridge and the tract called Standiggo  
to my son John. All together seven hundred and twenty four acres  
of land and on his having his material life ended  
I want of my said son John Anthony Hamilton dying without  
a will cause that it is my will and desire that the tract  
called land known by the name of Standiggo  
and my son William Anthony Hamilton my first son to have  
and hold forever and it is further my will and  
desire in the event of my said son Anthony Hamilton  
dying without lawful issue that the tract of land on  
which I reside the tract called Lawrence, the tract of  
the new road bridge shall go to my son John  
Anthony Hamilton my first son to have and hold  
forever and if he die without issue that the said tract  
of land shall go to my grand daughter the  
widow of George Washington 1775

Nicholas Davis arrived at the age of nearly one year  
Now it is my will and desire that the said negro boy Nash  
ington should be delivered to the hands of the Methodist Church  
of I give him to have & his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Washington  
one negro girl named Lucy daughter of Sam also all  
the household & kitchen furniture to him and his heirs  
forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my grand daughter  
Mary Turner one negro girl named Mary, daughter  
of little Betty to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to Virginia Turner my grand  
daughter, one negro child named Charlotte daughter  
of Molly to her & her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter  
Sarah J. Jenkins one negro girl named Lizzie daughter  
of Molly to her & her heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my grand son Joseph  
Jenkins one negro boy named David, son of James to him and  
his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Elizabeth  
Jenkins one negro girl named Jamaica daughter of  
James to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary  
Jenkins one negro child named Maria daughter of Robert  
to her & her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my grandson Edward Tom-  
pkins one negro boy the son of Robert, his oldest now  
living, to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to  
Catherine Jenkins one  
negro boy the  
son of Robert  
to her  
and her  
heirs  
forever

where I will one night bequeath John Son of Anna to  
John and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my grand daughter John H. Thorntons  
Richard Moore, Sons of my deceased daughter Anna Moore  
hundred dollars each to be paid by my executors within twelve  
months after my death

It is my will and desire that my executors  
after my death do sell on a Credit of twelve months my negro  
servant Battell and his wife Nancy and all the Chattels whic  
he has or may hereafter have together with all my horses and  
such of all kinds for the purpose of raising a fund to pay off  
legacies left my daughter Anna and my grand children  
John H. Moore, Richard Moore and Catharine Brookfield and  
equally to be divided between my Sons John  
and Arthur H. Armstrong Thornton to them and their heirs  
eternally

As I give and bequeath to my Son John Thornton and

I do Commande Thornton till the remainder of my personal  
and financial estate and herofore devised or disposed of  
in this my last Will and Testament to be especially divided  
between them and their heirs forever, and it is further my  
Will and desire that my Sons John Thornton Jr. & Am-  
ing Thornton pay out of the personal estates left them  
any just debts and funeral expenses  
I will. Represent my friends James Buhler, Doctor,  
Wells and family of Gaylor they Expected to bring  
to Hell and Judgment.
