4th I give to my daughter Jane my best Bed and Furniture, also my prime Chest and provisions to last this year. I also give to my Son's John and Robert one Bed a piece and Furniture. The rest of my Property must be sold and equally divided among all my Children. I hereby declare and desire that Betty Ann must not be sold out of the Family. In confirmation of the above I hereby have officia my hand this twenty fourth of February eighteen hundred and sixty five
