

Ended testimony File No. 25.
Copy of will of Mchutabel Dabney.

Mchutabel, widow of the County of Kansas and State of
Missouri do make this my last will and testament. I give to my
daughters Martha, Stuart, three shares in the Bank of Virginia.
I give to my daughter Sarah four shares in said bank, and also to my
daughter Lucy four shares in said bank. The remaining two I give
my son Wm. Dabney. And in consideration of
unity of shares I give him my watch, my late and houses
with sold and an equal division made of the proceeds to
all of my children. The negroes also to be divided and an equal
distribution made of them, with the privilege to Lucy Jackson of
using to which of my daughters she wishes to belong.
I give part of my real property that falls to my daughter
daughters, Martha, to be put in trust to her brother
the benefit of herself and children.

money arising from the sale of the lots to be had and
bank stock or anything else thought more advantageous
her benefit, and her brother is to permit to her every
year the dividend on said shares and she also is to receive her
and send her the same and the end of every quarter
property for Martha, to be subject to no debt of her hus-
band that may have been or shall hereafter be contracted by him
subject only to her ^{own} order and kept for the entire benefit of
self and children. I give also my servant Judith to my
daughter Sarah and leave the property of my daughters Sarah
Lucy entirely for their benefit not to be subject to the debts
my husband. I leave also to my daughter Martha my largest
room in the house. I leave to my daughter Martha and Lucy
my old woman Sarinda to be taken care of as long as
the lives and hope they will not be unmindful of
