1st I wish all my just debts to be paid.

2nd I give and bequeath to my Sister Alice White and her heirs forever, one hundred and fifty dollars.

3rd I give and bequeath to my Sister Eliza McDowell and her heirs forever two hundred dollars.

4th Should my Nephew William Partlow be living at my death, it is my will that my executor pay to him out of my estate the sum of one hundred dollars. if dead I wish the same equally divided between the children of my Sister Eliza McDowell.

5th I loan to my brother Warner White during his life four hundred and sixty dollars. at his death I wish to have to go to his son Melman L. White.

6th As my Sister Alice White and myself are secumitors to a bond executed by my brother William White to William Hancock for about three hundred dollars, it is my will should said bond be not paid at my death that my executor hold enough of the sum loaned to my brother William White to pay off and satisfy the same.

7th I give and bequeath to my brother Silas White all the balance of my estate of every kind, and all claims together with my remaining interest in the estate of my father William White deceased and every other interest that may accrue to me

8th I hereby appoint my brother Silas White executor to this my last will and Testament with the wish that the Court will not require him to give security when he qualifies in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this fifteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and fifty
