Copy of the Will of Milton M. Brown.

9/18/04
Milton M. Brown of the county of Thomas being of perfect mind and memory do make this my last will in the following manner viz: I wish my Executors when after named to pay all my debts out of the moneys in hand and due to me now and at the time of my death.

I desire that my Executors include the space at the burying ground at Hollawing, Creek left for my wife and her two Sisters the side of my daughter James A. Brown with a good fast railing and that a slab of stone be placed at the head and foot of the grave of my daughter and one at the top of a brick wall around the grave with a suitable inscription.

I wish to be buried at the old family Burying ground and I now live and that my Executors, have the slabs of stone wall around around my grave with a like suitable inscription.

I lend to my wife Emily, Mitchell all my white bath suit and
personal during her widowhood at her death or marriage I give the
same to her children by the said Charles C. Mitchell to them and their
heirs forever.

It is my wish and desire that my sister shall at any time after any of
her children arrives at the age of twenty one or marry advance to them
a portion of the property bequeathed to her in the 4th clause of this my
will, that she may think proper provided it does not exceed her
share of my estate and it is my earnest request and desire that
my sister and her children, treat the slaves kindly bequeathed and
entrusted to them on the most human manner so as to induce them
to be true and faithful servants during life.

I give to Pamela Hall twelve dollars annually during
single life provided she maintains her integrity because
of her faithful services to my wife after her return from
Western Asylum at Staunton.

I wish and desire that Patsy Hall the wife of -

of Zachariah Hall and her children be permitted to live on my plantation with the use of a house garden spot and firewood during the life of said Patey.

7th I wish and desire that my wife Elizabeth be supported out of my estate in such manner as her situation requires and that she be taken care of.

8th I hereby appoint William, Hatch and Geo. W. Parnish Executors to this my last will and desire that no security be required of them and for their services as such I wish them to receive one and a half percent on the appraised value of my real and personal estate. Witness my hand and seal this 21st day of October 1852.
