

I Oberbach Archer of the County of Hanover do make this
my last will and Testament.

1st I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Jane
Timberlake and Marinda Philip Archer all my Land lying on
the North Side of the creek leading from Hanover Town to Richmond
to them and their heirs forever.

2^d I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Marinda Philip
Archer one of my best beds & furniture, and my Bureau to her
and her heirs forever.

3^d I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Arthur Bee
Timberlake one of my second best Beds & furniture to her and
her heirs forever.

4th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally & Croft the
Land whereon, she now lives together with the house with
Kitchen furniture now in her possession and the property con-
veyed to me by her late husband, Samuel N Croft and all debts
and demands I may have against the said Samuel N Croft to her
and her heirs forever.

5th I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Elizabeth Jane
Timberlake all the debts and demands I may have against her
late husband Benjamin Timberlake to her and her heirs forever.

6th I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Benjamin
Timberlake, my best Gun to him and his heirs forever.

7th My will and desire is that my executor hereafter
named shall sell all my perishable estate not herein before
mentioned.

Timberlake, my best Son to live and his heirs forever.

7th. My will and desire is that my executor herein after named Sell all my perishable estate not already devised herein out out of the proceeds of such Sale pay my debts. Should the proceeds arising from such Sale prove insufficient to discharge my debts and free my estate from pecuniary embarrassment then my will is that my Son here out my Negroes or such of them as he may think best, for a sum sufficient with the proceeds of the Sale of my possible property to be devised for the purpose.

8th I give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my estate to be equally divided between my Children to them and their heirs forever. In which division it is my will that Benjamin Neelyman who intermarried with my Daughter Ann account for a Negro Girl named Fanny, advanced to him by me some years ago at the price of Six hundred Dollars.
Lastly, I appoint my Son in Law Perry W. Elliott my Executor withup my hand this 20th of June 1856. 155
