Copy of the Will of Peter M. Chick.

the name of God Amen.

Peter M. Chick of Homers County, being in my natural mind do
by this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form

33 First. I commit my soul to God and my body to be decently
buried. My Will and desire is that all my just debts be paid and
funeral expenses.

Second. I give to my Wife Mary Ann Chick, my slaves namely
Mary, Charlotte, James Monroe, James, Amosella, Manuel,
Susan, James Robertson and Rosa and their increase.

My land to be divided say to begin at the foot May Landing leading to
Mr. Smiths on Locust Creek, starting at a Willow at the crossing
place, making two small Persimmon trees, standing on the stream
about twenty yards this side of the Willows mentioned on the Creek
take the line, from thence along the old school path to my Spring
thence to the old stone fence to the Spring to the

thence up the Spring Branch to the gum spring to be
to the right along the ditch to the West until it comes to two
common trees, on the said Spring Branch thence up the Branch
to the first fork where stand two other common trees, near the fork
to the corner tree, from thence in a straight line due
to John B. Jones line. The land on the West side from corner
to the above said Jones line I give to my wife Mary Ann
her.

the east side of said line I lend to my son brother Dennis
Chick one half of the land during his life time at his death my
will is that it should be equally divided between my three
daughters, John R. Chick and Rebecca Ellen Turner, the other
half of the east side of said line I give to Nancy B. Jones;
the other half I give to my brother Dennis B. Chick agrees
that he will give Amanda Wilson, Elizabeth and
Mary Ann his share after which
I have signed this my last will and testament in his presence

Mama and her daughter, Elizabeth and their increase
Wilson the above named boy I give to my nephew
Robert Jones my sister Patience her Amanda the above
named girl I give to Anna Elden Hayland my niece
Stem. I give to Mary L. Jones Negroes, Mary, Laura
Alexander Lucian and Charles, Bunkley and their increase
I give her one feather bed and furniture; one cow and calf, five sheep
one sow and pigs one black mare called "Flint" five barrels corn
Stem. I give to my brother Lewis B. Chick named above one black mare
^{from I give to my wife Mary Stem which my ring}
called White foot. Horse black one gray mare called Bob.
One bay colt called Struck, the balance of my stock Hogs, Sheep
and Cattle Buggy or cart Household and Kitchen furniture
plantation Tools.

Stem. I give to my nephew Samuel P. Jones one negro
named Robertson my blacksmith, and my gun and no
more of my Estate.

I give to Nathaniel H. Turner, William Locke James Turner
and Th. R. ...

And their heirs. Negroes to be especially divided (namely Robert
Montgomery, Henry Burman and Chapman.

them. I give the rest of my brothers and sisters (namely) Burnwell Chick William Chick Amster Chick John B. Chick. Patsey Alden Jones. Nancy Bluford Phillips and my nephew Burnwell P. Jones who is to have no more of my estate - Margaret Anne Hawthorne, Solomon Hoey, Susan Julia, John Peter Lila, Myatt, Betty Amelia Randolph, Jacob Richmond Lewis and their increase to be equally divided.

Item I give to Cousin William Bagby one negro girl named
 Martha. Item I give to his son William Bagby
 one more Bolt called William.

I give to William S. Clark
 of the County of Clark, State of Nevada
 the sum of \$100.00

William Bagby my lawful Executor to this my last Will and
Testament This 11th day of March 1854.
