Copy of the Will of Jacob Littlepage.

The name of God Amen.

Jacob Littlepage of the City of Richmond, at present in ill health of body, but of sound mind and memory, do constitute and ordain this as my last will and testament, that is to say, I give and bequeath To Mary Petherford, a little black girl now living To her and her heirs forever.

I give To Augustus Smith Petherford a little black boy named Blairborn To him and his heirs forever.

I give the mother of the children above named, To Patsy Petherford To her and her heirs forever.

I give To Doctor James Blair, my proportion of the landed estate of my deceased father which lies in the County of Henrico, near Pole-green meeting-house To him and his heirs forever. I also desire that he will stand master for my women serving to protect her from harm.

I have signed my hand and seal this thirteenth day of May in the year of our Lord

His last Will and Testament of Sarah Littlepage deceased was proved by the oath
of John Pufferford a witness thereto and at the same Court of Hustings
the City of Richmond confirmed by adjournment and held at City Hall the
1st day of the same month by the oath of James H. Blair, also a witness
thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And at a Court of Hustings held
at the said City at the City Hall the 31st day of June 1823 on the
petition of James Blair who made oath to the said will and with
Thomas Pufferford his security entered into and ac-
knowledged a bond in the penalty of one thousand

dollars, conditioned as the law directs, certificate was granted him for
obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Sarah Littlepage
with her said will annexed in due form.
