

Warren County, 26 June 1852

I Susan White of the County aforesaid being in feeble health but in sound mind and memory knowing it is appointed to all men to die do make this my last will and Testament

First it is my wish my body may be decently interred and my funeral expenses paid out of my Estate

Second and all my just debts to be paid

Third I give to my Nephew Samuel White for his kindness to me and husband Robert being well acquainted with his management of my Estate of Every kind both mixed and otherwise three negroes namely Jordan a man about 50 years old Mary Jane a girl about 15 years old, and the first woman about 70 years old that I own which he will take care of until he decease.

Fourth I appoint Samuel White my executor to the my last will and Testament revoking all other wills made by me here before my hands and seal this the 26 day of June 1852
