Concord January 21st 1841
Copy of the Will of Timothy Goodman

I Timothy Goodman of the County of Monroe and State of Georgia taking into consideration the certainty of death, but being uncertain when that event will happen have determined at this time to make this my last Will and testament before death, so as of body or the infirmities of age weakens or diminish my understanding or memory which I do in form and manner following.

I sign.

I leave my just debts to be paid by my executors hereafter and the rest few and so small amounts will bequeath to Estabba Gilleam Crawford, at present living in the State of Georgia, the right of the following negroes to it Sarah Flannery Lucy Lewis Remond. Raddy French and his wife to him and his heirs forever.

and I will give to my beloved William Bradbury of the Standard

out and divide to my nephew William Goodman of the town of
South Carolina at Vienna the four following tracts of land
my John, Dennis and Peter to him and his heirs forever
and land above to my nephew Edmund Goodman the three
hundred acres to Miss Mary Green and her heirs to him
and his heirs forever.

and and devise to my nephew Zachariah Goodman the two
hundred acres following to Miss Maria & Delphine to him and his
heirs forever.

and and devise to James Vaughan who lives with Mr.
Professor George in the County of Louisa one hundred acres to
him and his heirs forever.

and to my brother William Goodman the tract of land whereon
we now live or called the land called Henderick together with the
rights to Miss Matilda, Maria, and James
Vaughan upon the natural life upon their condition, and
no provision shall be done nor clear my land
from under my back as many as

overeas far forward, fearing to make dangerous casts
she, I give to my said brother William Goddard so much
land and meat as will be sufficient in the opinion of one
of them for him and his family for ever of all the land
and meat he may want on the plantation at the time of my
death than my Executor to keep him at for his life
to my will and desire that the plantation hereby left
to my brother William for life should at his death
be sold, both land and negroes and the amount of the
sales to be equally divided among all his two
said brothers, William Goddard's children the sale
to be made on such credit as my Executor may think to
the interest of the children of my said brother William
the amount of which sales, I give to them and their suc-
cessors.

I give to my brother Charles Goddard one Negro woman
named Melody with all her future increase, from

This time, to him and his heirs forever.
It is my will that my Executor, searching no much
less perfect stock of the United States as that the
inhabitants of the same shall contribute to the sum
of fifty dollars to commence which sum of fifty dollars
my Will and Will that my Executor pay out annually
for the use of Joseph Scoville Goodman and his
and his wife and their posterity, for their comfort and
convenience, the said Joseph Scoville Goodman to have no
command or right to the said fifty dollars annually,
to be drawn from the interest aforesaid, but my said
Executor to have said Stock transferred to themselves
