

Copy of the Will of William Cocker.

In the name of God Amen.

I William Cocker of the Parish of Saint Paul in the County of
Monmouth do make this my last Will and Testament.

I first unto my daughter Sarah Combs the four negro
slaves David, George, Peggy, & Hannah and at her death it is my
will and desire that the said slaves with the increase of the females
may be equally divided among the children of my said daughter
which may be alive at her death, but in case any of her children shall
die in her life time leaving issue that such issue shall have
part of their parent had he or she been alive at the time
of the death of my said daughter.

I give and bequeath unto my son in law Richard P.
Combs five head of sheep.

I give and bequeath unto my son in law Henry Flint
three negro slaves to wit, Betty, Betsy and Lewis, one

on I give and bequeath unto my son in law Henry
three negro Slaves to wit, Betty Betty and Lewis, one
and five head of Sheep to him and his heirs forever.
I give and bequeath unto my son William Cooke my
Slaves to wit James Robert and Alfred, one horse, one
and five head of Sheep and a bed and furniture to him
and his heirs forever.

I have unto my beloved wife during her life the tract
land whereon I now reside, all the plantation utensils the
tools of all kinds the household and kitchen furniture and the
stock not before mentioned and the following Slaves to wit, John
Walter, Charles, Wilson, Stephen, Ben, Eggy, Pehoda, Grace and
Maria. And it is my Will and desire that my wife pay my
debts out of the Crops stock and furniture but her executors.

At the death of my wife I give unto my grand daughter
the daughter of my son Joseph Anderson Cooke five
and five head of Sheep to be paid out of that part of
the estate that I have unto my wife and of land.

Now said I give and bequeath unto my Son William and
to his heirs forever, and the balance of my estate unto my
Wife as aforesaid I give and bequeath unto my Three Children
Sarah Camp, Elizabeth Hunt and William Cooke to be
equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever
and whereas it is uncertain whether my said Son Joseph
Anderson Cooke be now alive or not, but in case he shall
return, then I give him at my Wifes death one half of my said
tract of land and the said Slaves Mat Charles and Nelson
to him and his heirs forever and in the event of his
returning, I do hereby revoke the devise to his said Daughters
as aforesaid.

Item Whereas I have heretofore given unto some of my Children
some property by way of advancement I do now hereby confirm
such gifts to them and their heirs forever.
Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son William
Cooke and my Sons in law Richard P. Camp and James
P. F. H. 27
