A copy of the Will of William Pollard.

In the name of God Amen

I give to my beloved wife the following named mine negroes to wit: Susan

Cooper Jacob, Milnes, Sally Fleming, Henry, Lewis, Amariah & Elizabeth

with their future increase of the female, to her and her heirs forever:

I give to my Grand Daughter Susan Parracott, the children of Delphin

in the possession of her father, to her and her heirs forever: but on this

condition that in case of her death under ^{age} and therefore unmarried, the

same shall go to her sister Mary to her and her heirs forever.

I leave to my wife all the rest of my estate both real and personal during her

life and widowhood, subject to the limitations restricting and encumbering

as herein after mentioned that is to say first to the payment of

my debts, then to the liberal education of my son George Withers and

his maintenance until he shall become entitled to share in my estate

when my son comes to the age of twenty one years or his lawful issue female

have one half of what shall remain of the estate left to my wife, both real and
and personal to him and his heirs forever.

On the death or marriage of my wife, I give to my said son all the residue
of the estate left to my wife and as many more of my negroes as shall
come with the one half already given him under thirty three in all,
and I also give to him my said son the residue of my personal estate
in which I give to him and his heirs forever.

If my wife should die, or marry before my son comes to the age of
twenty one years or has lawful issue that part of my estate provided for
him to wit: all my real estate thirty three negroes and all the residue
of my personal estate shall go to him immediately to him and his
heirs forever. But if my son should die under the age of twenty one
years and without lawful issue the estate given him is to go
to my daughters, Barnard, and Shappard, to hold during
their respective lives, and then to their children forever.
My Executors and Executors are at liberty to sell any
of my negroes should it be necessary to accomplish

the objects herein before mentioned, which are bequeathed to my wife after which I shall have been some and my estate finally settled, I should have then remain more than thirty thousand I have given to my son, I give the surplus of the said income that is to say all over the thirty thousand of which there are at this time fifteen, beside, those given to my wife to my two Daughters aforesaid to hold the same during their respective lives and thereafter to their children forever.

I desire that my wife may act as guardian of my son, and take the advice of my much respected friend the Revd Genl. Quamers in respect to his education.

my debts being inconsiderable, and my Executors and Executor being principally interested in my Estate, I desire that neither of them be required to give security, nor to have my will approved. I appoint my wife Executor and should my son come to the age of twenty years, I appoint him Executor.

The foregoing is my Will, wholly written with my own hand

day of April 1830.

The provision made for my wife in the foregoing will is in full of Power.

At a Court of Quarterly Session held for Lancaster County at the Courthouse on Wednesday the 22nd of February 1832. Their meeting purporting to be the last will and testament of William Pollard died was offered for proof by Elizabeth A. Pollard. The execution in the said writing named: And Rank Street and Philip B. Winston being sworn and examined then being no subscribing witness to the said writing declared that they are well acquainted with the handwriting of the said deceased, that they have examined the said writing and the circumstances thereof and are fully satisfied that it is the true and lawful will of the said deceased.

from Pollard died; Whereupon the same are ordered to be
recorded as the last Will and Testament of the said
William Pollard died.
