I William U. Degarnette of the County of Hanover &
State of Virginia do make this my last will and
testament - viz: I am satisfied with the will the law makes
except, I wish & desire that all my negroes and other prop-
erty that I got by my wife should be here in fee simple and all
interest I hold in certain lands negroes &c conveyed to me by the
purchase of a schedule of William Williamson, conveying a
balance (should there be any) after satisfying a debt of trust given
by said William Williamson to Charles Thompson to satisfy
certain sums of money therein mentioned, I give to my Sister
Elizabeth C. Williamson & her heirs forever after her paying
the amount I gave for the schedule & lastly I appoint John
Gottaris & Mr. D. Winston my executors to this my last will
and testament. Given under my hand & seal this 11th day
of October 1840. Signed and sealed in presence of
