In the name of God amen, I Andrew Aubrey late of Paris in France being at present
in the Parish of King William in the County of Henrico, very sick of my Body only,
but by the Grace of God sound of Spirit memory & understanding, & calling to remembrance
the uncertainty at all time of this fragille & mortall life, for this reason I doe make & ordaine
this my last will & Testament in manner & forme following, Viz
First, I resigne my Soule to God that gave it, in hope of pardon & remission of all my Sinns
in & through y^e meritts & passion of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ, & my Body to be decent
ly Interred at the discretion of my hereafter named Executors,
Item, I Give & bequeath to my Godson Andrew Ammonet the Sum of four pounds upon
Jacob Ammonet his Father for rest of all Account till this day, & beside the third part in all
my Goods & Chables, which shall be found after my Death, movable & immovable & in
what part of the World soever it exists.

Henrico County February 1715

Item, I give & bequeath to Margaret Anna & Elizabeth Romy one other third part for them both in my ^{d.} Goods & Chattles as above said; & to Joseph Cailland the tother third part in the ^{d.} Goods & Chattles as above ^{s.} on condition that the said Cailland shall pay out of his third part, the sum of five pounds Sterling or the value thereof to the poor of the ^{d.} Parish at the discretion of my hereafter named Executors, all this after my just debts & funerals charges are paid.

Item I make & ordaine to be Executors of this my last will & Testament, my trusty & well beloved friends Jacob Ammonot & Joseph Cailland. I do declare yt. this is my will that I will have the same put into Execution after my Death, without alter any thing in it, as a Testament Codicilo or Gift made for occasion of Death in the best forme according to law & Customs, derogating to all laws & Customs generally, notwithstanding any contrary to it. In witness whereof & Confirmation of the same I did Signe with my own hand this my Testament, & Sealed with my Seal in presence of the witnesses under Subscribed this 28.th day of ^{g.} 1715:
