Item. I give to my loving Sister Elizabeth Coeks my plantation lying upon Mauleburn hill to her and her heirs forever

Item I give unto my loving Sister Mary Finny my Negro woman called my Negro Girl Comp together with my Negro girl that was born at Mr Richard Coeks about four year old with their Jureasse to her and her heirs forever

Item. I give to my Sister Elizabeth my Negro woman named Janny and my Negro girl named Judith with their Jureasse to her & her heirs forever

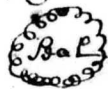
Item. As the rest of my Estate of what kind soever I give to be equally divided between my two Brothers James Powell Coeks and Brasius Coeks excepting my best suit of Cloathes which I hereby give to my younger Brother Brasius Coeks, in consideration that when I was last in Virginia I lent severall things to my Brother James which I hereby give to him to be no longer considered as any part of my Estate

Lastly I appoynt my loving Brothers M^r William Finny and James Powell Coeks Joynt Executors of this my last will and Testament, In witness whereof I have Signed Sealed and published this my last will and Testament on board the Shipp Harrison now bound for Virginia this first day of Feb^r

In the presence of Gode I upon the Sixteen day of March In the year of our Lord God Seventeen hundred and fifteen and in the first year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord King George I Benjamin Watson of the parish and County of Henrico being sick and weak in body but of good and perfect memory praised be the Almighty God I do constitute make and Ordaine this my last will and Testament in manner and forme following.

I Commend my Soul into the hands of almighty God my Creator & Redeemer my Body to the Ground from whence it came to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son John Watson my Plantation whereon Lewis Orange now lives with thirty five acres of Land to him and his heirs of his Body forever for what of such Ears to return to his Sister Judith and after Lewis Orange turne out to lye void til he comes of age my Intent is that he may have it in full possession at the age of Eighteen

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Watson One hundred and forty acres of Land lying upon the head of Gillies Creek to him and his Ears forever
Item I give and bequeath unto my son John One large featherbed bolster and pillows well fill two good sheets a pear of blanket good Rugg a Bett of Curtain and Vallon and the Negro coach fine and all her future -
Increase and One Iron pot hold about five or six Gallon three Powder Dishes to plates three powder Spoons One silver Spoon Two Cows and Calves two Efers two year old One Steer four year old Two Sows and pigs four barrow two year old two yokes and Sams One beay Mare One horse full and both their future increase

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Judith the plantation I first lived at Joyning upon peg Sketh and the plantation my mother Watson now lives on with two hundred and forty acres of Land belonging to them both - and seven pound three shillings Sterling money upon the day of marriage or sixteen years of age One Iron pot and pot hook pot holes about four Gallon Two deep powder Dishes One flat powder Dish two plates three powder Spoons One silver Spoon One powder Tumbard One powder -
Morrington a new frying pan two Cows and Calves two Efers two year old and a Sows One Steer four year old two Sows and pigs four barrow two year old and a Sows two yokes and Sams One horse Mare with all her future -
Increase

Item I give and bequeath unto my Brother in Law William Allen my new suit of Drust Cloaths and One black Mare Sprigg tals and her filley with all their future Increase

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John my Gun and my Carbine
Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Aggrey Watson the plantation I now live on with all the Land thereunto belonging during her life and after her death to my son John and his Ears forever with seven teen five Acres lying upon Gillies Creek I give to my wife and her Ears forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife all other my personall Estate in what Quality soever whom I ordain to be my whole and sole executrix of this my last will and Testament And witness my hand the Day and Date above written in the line before signed

Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife all other my personall Estate in what Quality soever whom I ordain to be my whole and sole executrix of this my last will and Testament And witness my hand the Day and Date above written in the line before signed
