unperfect memory Sence & Judgment do make this my last will & Testament Denying  
all wills & Testaments made by me at any other time . . . . .  
I do give my Soul to God almighty, who gave it to me, in hopes & firm Assurance  
of his blest Salvation in heaven & my Estate I do dispose of as followeth, I Give unto  
my eldest Sister, Anna Walhall, one yard of Muslin two yards of black Ribbon  
if my Sister Mavel does Marrie with William Puchett, then I Give her one Shilling  
if she does not marry with none of the Puckets then my new goods to be divided  
between my Sister Anna & my Sister Mavel and if my Sister does Marry with any  
of the afores<sup>d</sup> Puckets, then my younger Sister Mary to have half my new Goods  
& my Sister Anna to have the other half, & one black hood one Virginia Cloath  
petticoat to my Sister Catherine I give one pair of gold ear Cobs one Parmer  
sa boone & one pair of new Gloves one fann one mask one pair of new Phil  
librian China Bodys & two Stomagers one Stof gown & Coat & my Bible with  
Silver Cappes to my younger Sister Mary I give my Bed & furniture, I do give  
unto my Sister Elizabeth Walhall the money she haves in her hands which  
is due to me, from my fathers estate in Estimation three pounds, I give unto  
my two youngest Brothers Farrah Walhall & Frances Walhall all my cattle  
& hogs which is due to me of my Fathers Estate, I give to my Brother Henry  
my Chest of Drawers & three Silver Spoons, I give to my Brother Richard my  
Trunk I do make ordayne & appoint my two Brothers Richard & Henry Wal-  
hall my Executors to see this my will fulfilled, whereunto I have set my

Know all men by these presents that I Arthur Croxon of the County of Henrico have assigned, ordayne, & made & in my stead & places by these presence put & Constituted my trusty & well beloved friend George Wilson of the aforesaid County to be my true & lawfull Attorney for me & in my name to ask sue for levy recover & receive of any person or persons whatsoever all & every such debts & sum of money, which are now due unto me by any manner of ways or means whatsoever & to pay all & every such debts & sums of money which shall be made appear to be due from me to any person or persons whatsoever, giving & granting to my said Attorney, my whole power strength & Authority in & about the premises for me & in my name, to do execute & perform, as fully, largely, & amply, in every respect, to all intents constructions & purposes, as I my self might or could do, if I were there in my own person present, ratifying & allowing firm & stable all & whatsoever my said Attorney shall lawfully doe or cause to be done in or about the Execution of the premises, by virtue of these presents. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 9<sup>th</sup> day of March 1713.
