the name of Damfoll and One red heffier of about three years old to his
Daughter Elizabeth and her inwafe

Item I give and bequeath to my Son in Law James Gates One young Mare
Together with all the rest of my Estate goods and Chattells not mentioned
before and I nominate and appoynt the said James Gates my Executor
of this my last will and Testament — In witness whereof I have hereunto
Sett my hand and affixt my Seal this 19th day of August 1715.
