ly I will and Ordain that my beloved Son Robert Tarqafson Sen^r should have my
feather bed and bolster two pillows one pillow case one blanket, two sheets, one tessen,
one canvas, one bedstead, and two Curtains, and Valens, rods, and one Couch. thirdly, I will and
ordain that my Daughter Amestopkins, should have one Cow name Blackbird, one Hogg,
one holland Sheet, and all my wareing Clothes, both woollen, and linnen, fourthly, I will
and Ordain that my eldest great Grandson John Tarqafson Jun^r should have one small
pot and pot hook one pot rack. fifthly, I will and Ordain that my Son Peter Aslibrook
should have one Shilling. Sixthly I will and Ordain that my Granddaughter Elizabeth
Aslibrook have one Cow calf. seventhly, I will and Ordain that my Grandson John Tarqafson
Sen^r have the other part of my Estate both goods and Chattels and that the said John
Tarqafson to take actual possession as soon as I am deceased, whom I now ordain as
Exorutrics of this my last will and Testament, for Confirmation and in Testimony of the

Know all men by these presents that We William Baugh and Lodwick Tanner both of the County of Henrico for and in Consideration of the sum of five Shillings do hereby to us in hand paid by Edward Tanner William Ligon Edward Haskins and Martha his Wife all of the same County the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge have remitted released and for ever quit claimed and by these presents for us and our heirs & assigns clearly and absolutely remise release and for ever quit claim unto the said Edward Tanner William Ligon Edward Haskins and Martha his Wife and to their heirs and assigns for ever in their quiet and peaceable possessions and Seizins all our estate right title Interest claim and demand which have or may have of in or to the land set a part and divided by Richard Ligon for Edward Tanner beginning at the first Spring bottom at the River side at a corner white Oak from thence up the bottom and by W. & N. 1/2 to a mark hickory at the head of the said bottom on the East side thence considering the said corner to the head line thence W. & N. 1/2 132 pool to a corner white Oak standing with M^r. Baugh's line thence N. & E. 304 pool to the mouth of middle Spring bottom at the River side at a gum tree thence down to the meanders of the said River to the place began and also the bounds of W^m.
