Robert Collo my Plantation which lyeth in Charles City County which he now
liveth upon together with all goods and chattels it may be of him as well as
half the land that belongeth to that tract or patrull of land belonging to this
Plantation to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give unto my son Joseph Collo
the other Plantation that lyeth upon the said tract with all goods and chattels
and the other half of the land to him and his heirs forever. Item I give unto my
daughter Anne Collo my money and to her Son John my own gun. Item I give unto my son James
do all the land from the Root of Red Cherry tree to William Wests line and
two horsebors and all my working tools of all sorts and all my household stunes
and a Dentition bed that he lyeth on and bed Cloathes. Item I give to my
Wife Easter Collo the other part of his Plantation with the houses belongeth to it
and the Orchard in during her life and all the rest of the goods and chattels
belonging to me to be at her disposall only the land and house being returning to
my son James after her decease. Item I do constitute my wife to be my lawful
executrix as witness my hand and seal this 25th of February 1717

Lord 1718 between Richard Cooke Junr. of the Parish and County of Henrico Gent.
of the one part and Bowler Cooke of the same Parish & County Gent. of the other part
Witnesseth That the aforesaid Richard Cooke for the valuable consideration of
Livery of Heriot to him in hand paid hath given granted bargained aliened and sold and
by these presents doth give grant bargain alien and sell unto the aforesaid Bowler Cooke
and his heirs for ever one tract or parcell of land lying on the North Side of James River
in the Parish and County of Henrico containing by estimation five hundred and Seventy
Acres beginning in the fork of the white Oak Swamp and bounded as by a Patent bearing
date the first day of May 1706 more fully doth appear to have and to
hold the aforesaid five hundred and Seventy acres of Land to the same more or
less to the aforesaid Bowler Cooke and to his heirs for ever with all Appurtenances
thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining In witness whereof the aforesaid
Richard Cooke hath hereunto set his hand and Seal the day and year first above mentioned
