of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and fourteen I Nicholas Dixon  
being sick of body but of perfect mind and memory do make and Ordain this  
to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say  
first and principally I commend my Soul to almighty God my Creator and  
Redeemer assuredly believing I shall receive full pardon and free remission  
of all my sins thro' the merits of my blessed Saviour and Redeemer Jesus  
Christ and my body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be buried in  
such decent manner as shall be thought meet and convenient by my Ex-  
ecutors hereinafter mentioned. And as to my worldly Estate my will and meaning is  
that same shall be disposed of as followeth, First I revoke frustrate and make  
void all wills by me formerly made and declare and appoint this to be my  
last will and Testament

Item. I give and devise unto my Son Edward Dison and his heirs forever  
 That tract plantation or Tract of Land he now liveth on containing by  
 Estimation Sixty Acres more or less bounded as followeth viz.  
 Beginning at a black oak standing on the hill side near the Swamp gutt marked  
 three ways, thence a direct line to a Blk Cherry Tree standing in the pasture  
 thence to a Line standing in the said Pasture, thence to a Line standing on the  
 Top of a hill, thence to a Blk Scrubby Oak standing on the East side of my cart  
 road, thence to a Line on the said road, thence to a Line on the said road,  
 thence to a Hickory on the said Road, thence to a pine standing on or near  
 the Dividing Line between me and the Land of Capt. John Wortham, thence  
 on the said Wortham's Line and so on the line of Will Kinton to the  
 hoggy pen mark thence up the said marsh to the place begun at

Item. I give and devise unto my Son Benjamin Dison and his heirs forever after  
 the decease of my wife Margaret all that Plantation or Tract of Land I  
 now live on being forty Acres more or less bounded as followeth. Beginning  
 at the old field standing of mill thence a direct line to a marked pine standing  
 on the west side of Quill. thence through the Oak field a direct line to a Line  
 separating in the pasture thence a direct line to a Hickory on the Round about  
 hill side, thence a direct line to a buller wood in the East part Black,  
 thence a direct line to a marked Buller wood, thence to a Gum, thence to a  
 red Oak, thence to a red oak thence to a Hickory separating on the Line between  
 Capt. John Wortham and me thence to a Corner Tree being a white  
 Oak standing in the Round about

Item. I give and devise unto my Son Thomas Dison and his heirs forever  
 fifty Acres of Land more or less being the remaining part of my Land

Item. I give to every One of my Children One shilling apiece payable within  
 One year if demanded

Item. I give unto my wife Margaret all the rest of my Estate after my Debts  
 and funeral Expenses paid, to dispose of as she shall think fitt here by  
 manding her my whole Sole Execut<sup>r</sup> of this my last will and Testament  
 As witness my hand and Seal the day and year above written
