Item I give and bequeath to my son Henry Walthall my Land from his Branch
called Lower side his Corn field where he now dwelleth to his Upper end

Item The remainder part of my Land not yet disposed of I give and bequeath
to my two Sons viz my son Jarrett Walthall and my son Francis Walthall
Equally to be divided between them the upper part I give and bequeath
