In the Name of God Amen Robert Good of the Parish and County of Henrico being
Weak of Body but of perfect mind and Memory blessed be God for it doth please and permit
my last Will and Testament in manner and form following I give and bequeath
the hands of Almighty God hoping through his meritorious Death and Passion for
sinners Jesus Christ to Receive free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and my body
decently buried at the Discretion of my Executrix hereafter named. I give and bequeath
that my Debts and Funerall Charges be paid and discharged. I give and bequeath
to my Son Robert Good the Plantation I now live upon known by the name of White
fanning by Estimation two hundred Acres more or less with all the Appurtenances
belonging to him and his heirs for ever but in case my said Son Robert Good should
happen to Die before he shall attain to the Age of twenty one Years or lawful Age to
aforesaid Plantation to full young Son Francis Good to him and his heirs for ever.
I give and Bequeath to my Son Francis Good my Negro Woman named Moll to him and his
heirs for ever with her Issue. Item I give unto my Sister Anna Good one heifer about
three Years Old with a calf by her side to be given her at the Age of Eighteen Years
on the Day of Marriage. Item I give unto my Son Robert Good three young cows
calves and four Sows and Pigs or with Pigg. Item I give unto my Son Francis Good
four cows and calves and four Sows and Pigs or with Pigg which said cows and calves and
Pigs they both shall Receive when they come to Lawfull Age. Item I give unto John Groon
the Sum of Ten Shillings to be paid in any convenient Sort in the aforesaid County upon
the first following next after my Decease. Item all the Rest and Residue of my personal
Estate I give and Bequeath to my Loving Wife Elizabeth Good and make her full and sole
Executrix of this my last Will and Testament Revoking Disannulling and making void
all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made Witness my hand and Seal
this 25th Day of May Anno Dom. 1718.
