

In the name of God Amen I W^m Soane of Henrico County being Sick and Weak of body but of perfect sense and memory thanks be to God, and calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life are willing to dispose of this worldly estate which it has pleased God to bestow upon me beyond my deserts first I give my Soul to God who made it hoping through the Merits of Christ of a Joyfull resurrection and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Ex^{rs} hereafter named.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Judith Thewatt twenty shillings for a mourning ring.

Item I give and bequeath to John Throat a Negro Girl which he had with my daughter Elizabeth If he survives me.

Item I give and bequeath my personal estate unto my three Sons John Henry and Samuel Soane and my daughter Martha Soane to be equally divided in kind or to be valued that to be at the discretion of the Ex^{rs}.

Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary all the Iron Pewter and Brass she brought with her and for the rest as she brought to be valued she being pay^d the valuation she being so satisfied from my estate If please God she survives me.

Item I give and bequeath to my three Sons John Henry and Samuel Soane my Plantation whereon I now live with all the land Joyning thereunto my Son John Soane having that part whereon the plantation is to them and their heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath also to my said three Sons all my land at the great Swamp to be also equally divided my Son John having the part where the plantation is

As for my land called Timothy Allens and my land in Charles City County to be sold the pay to be divided between John Henry, Samuel and Martha Soane

It is my will that my debts due to and from me as they are paid out or received in to be allowed equal amongst my four Children last mentioned.

As for my Slaves my Son John having them paying to my Son Henry and Samuel Soane each a third part of the valuation

I do appoint my Son John my whole and Sole Ex^{rs} of this my last Will and Testament as witness my hand and Seal this 18th Day of April 1714

In the Name of God Amen I Henry Waddins being sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect memory doe make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner and form following. First I Commit my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping that through the Merits of my dear Redeemer Jesus Christ to obtaine the Pardon and forgiveness of my sins and as to my worldly estate I dispose of as followeth

Impr. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Mary Waddins the Plantation whereon I now dwell with all the lands and appurtenances thereunto belonging for and during her natural life

I give and bequeath unto my Son John Waddins one Cow two dishes and one plate when he arrives to the age of twenty one years

I give unto my Son Benj: Waddins one Cow two dishes and one plate when he arrives to the age of twenty one years

I give unto my Son Joseph Waddins one Cow two dishes and one plate when he arrives to the age of twenty one years

I give unto my Son Henry Waddins one Cow two dishes & one plate when he arrives to the age of twenty one years

I give unto my Son Steph: Waddins one Cow two dishes one plate when he arrives to the age of twenty one years

But if any of my said Sons depart this life before they arrive to the age of twenty one then their bequest to return unto my wife Mary Waddins

All the rest of my goods and Chattels of what sort or kind soever they be I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Waddins Ormning and accounting in whole and Sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament This I doe here to seth my hand and Seal this 15. day of November 1714
