I give devise and bequeath as in manner following when my funeral Charges are paid. Item I give and bequeath to my son William one Shilling Currant money. Item I give and bequeath unto my son John one Shilling Currant money. Item I give and bequeath my son James one Shilling Currant money. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane Jordan one Shilling Currant money. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Martha Mathews one Shilling Currant money. Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson John Watkins the bead as it stands which I now lye on one small Chest one black Hoiffer with a white face 2 small Deep Dishes and 30 shroby will and I decree that my said Grandson shall have the Copp of Lewis and Cobato and what ever Elfe of that King that is now on the plantation and also the what that is now sown when the same shall come to perfection. Lastly my will is that my son say Whillos shall be wholly and solely Executor of this my ~~will~~ will and Testament hereby making all other wills void hereafter by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 21<sup>st</sup> Day of November 1729 ratoad before signing

Test. Henry Wood

This indenture made this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of Jan<sup>r</sup> in the year of our Lord 1727 between John Martin of the parish of King W<sup>m</sup> and County of Henrico of the one part and Edw<sup>d</sup>. Bryers of the same parish and County of y<sup>e</sup> other part witnesseth that the said John for and in consideration of twenty pounds Currant money to him in hand paid by y<sup>e</sup> said Edw<sup>d</sup>. Bryers y<sup>e</sup> receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath granted given bargained sold aliened devised and confirmed and by these presents do give grant bargain sell alien out off and sell firm unto y<sup>e</sup> said Edward Bryers and to his heirs for ever a certain tract of Land containing by Estimation Ninety two acres two Rods and twenty pole to y<sup>e</sup> same more or less situate lying and being in y<sup>e</sup> parish of King W<sup>m</sup> and County of Henrico and is bounded as <sup>will</sup> appear by patent granted to the said John Martin dated y<sup>e</sup> 31<sup>st</sup> day of October 1716 together with all Houses orchards gardens fences and appurtenances whatsoever to y<sup>e</sup> same belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold y<sup>e</sup> said Land and premises with their and every of their appurtenances together with y<sup>e</sup> reversion and reversions remainder & remainders thereof unto the said Edward Bryers his heirs & assigns for ever and that the said John Martin y<sup>e</sup> above sold Land and premises unto the said Edward his heirs and assigns against him the said John his heirs and assigns and against all other persons whatsoever shall and will by these
