Day of the resurrection and as touching my worldly Estate with what it shall please God to bestow upon me,
I give and dispose of the same, as followeth I have given and Bequeath all my Lands in Broomoody Hundred
to my Dear and loving Mother during her Natural life, with all houses and orchards the same unto belonging
and after her Death to my loving Brother Richard Ippes and his heirs forever, on Condition my said Brother
Richard his heirs & shall let my Brother William Ippes his heirs & peaceably and quietly enjoy all that
Toucheth the same
