 Quarter part of mill and Land, or any part or parcel thereof and further I the said Robert Hudson doth Olyze
 myself my heirs that if the said Henry Hatcher finds that this deed be not lawful according to the true meaning
 he may have it mended on his own Cost at any time within the space of Seven years & witness my hand
