 due payment of all other publick Dues and fees which shall be put into his hands to collect, and
 which shall be Dues and payable from persons residing within the said County unto such persons
 who by law are entitled to receive the same, and shall also have performed most of all other Manner and
 things relating to his Office of Sheriff during his continuall termes in this his Obligation to be observed,
 whereupon he shall be in full freed power and Authority
