 topher Martin of the County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Sam^l. Haqsdale for
 in consideration of five shillings of Lawfull Money of England to him in hand paid before
 the sealing & Delivery hereof the receipt whereof the said Sam^l. Haqsdale doth hereby acknow-
 ledge and thereto and of every part thereof doth acquit and discharge the said Christopher Martin
 his Executors and assigns by these presents hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth
 grant bargain and sell unto the said Christopher Martin his Executors and assigns all that tract
 and parcell of Land lying and being on the North Side of Appomattox River in the County aforesaid
 viz^t beginning at the main County Road in Godfrey Haqsdale's line thence along the same top to
 Haqsdale's line thence along Peter Haqsdale's line to the pine blake thence up the said blake to George
 Arthur Son's line thence down George's line along the road to the beginning containing one
 hundred Acres be the same more or less and the portion remainder and remainders his and
 every part and parcell &c &c thereof to have and to hold the said Land and premises herein
 before mentioned and intended to be hereby granted bargained and sold with there and every
 their appurtenances unto the said Christopher Martin his Executors adm^r and assigns from the
 day of the date hereof for and during the full and true term of years
