In the Name of God Amen I Edward Stanly of Henrico County being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory praised be god & calling to mind the uncertainty of this life am willing to dispose of what worldly estate it hath pleased god to bless me with as followeth Imprimis I give my soul to god who gave it hoping through y^e merits of jesus Christ to receive pardon & remission for all my sins & my body to be buried at y^e discretion of my Exec^t hereafter named Item I give and bequeath to my Daugh^r Hannah Throat one Shilling Sterling Item I give & bequeath to my loving wife Martha Stanly & to her heirs for ever one feather bed & furniture which she brought to me viz one blue yam self rugg three Eight quarter blankets five Sheets a cord & hide also one Sheer at five years old two at two years old and two cows also one gray Mare branded with a pair of fire tongues likewise six breeding Dows eight barrows & three Sheats one Iron pot of about three gallons one Chaff and one Couth four powder Dishes four plates & one basin cup & salt cellar of powder one Iron pessle & one Gridiron &c Item I also give and bequeath to my said wife y^e third part of my Land and my Indian fellow named Tom During her life Item I give & bequeath to my Granddaughter Frances Throat my two plantations in Henrico County the one whereon I now live & y^e other being that whereon Richard Dickeson lately dwelt to her self Frances and to her female heirs for ever Item I also give & bequeath to my Granddaughter for Frances Throat my negro fellow named Jack and and my Indian fellow after y^e decease of my wife to y^e s^t Frances & her female heirs for ever Item I give & bequeath to my 2^d Granddaughter Frances & one feather bed & bolster one Green yam self rug and one blanket and one Green plush side Saddle two Iron pots one holding abt ten gallons the other abt three gallons one Chaff two powder basins two Dishes &c Item I give & bequeath to my Granddaughter Mary Throat one feather bed &

Bolster one wooden ring and one blanket upon a brash Kettle holding about thirty gallons also also one Chest
and two pewter basons Item I give and bequeath to my Granddaughter Hannah Threut one feather
bed & a brash Kettle holding about three Gallons one Iron pot holding four or five Gallons upon Chest
Item I give & bequeath to Ralph Blankenship John Blankenship & James Blankenship my three plan-
tations at Coldwater run to them & their heirs for ever y^e said plantations containing two hundred &
thirty acres be y^e same more or less y^e S^t Ralph John and James holding the same severally as
they are possessed and according to y^e bounds as they have or shall agree should stand between them
Item I give & bequeath to my granddaughters aforesd frames Mary & Hannah each of them one
and one Cow or Heifer I do hereby constitute ordain & appoint my Loving wife Martha Stanly to be my
whole sole Exec^t of this my last will and Testament as witness my hand and Seal this twentyfirst
day of May one thousand seven hundred and twenty six.

memory thanks be God although not in perfect health do hereby ordain constitute and appoint this my
Last will & Testament as in manner following Imprimis I resign up my soul to Almighty God And
further believing in the merits of Jesus Christ my Redemeer and my body to be decently buried by
and at the Direction of my Executrix hereafter named as to my worldly Estate what it hath pleased
God to bestow upon me after my debts and funeral charges are paid I give and bequeath as followeth
Item I give and bequeath to my Son Matthew Branch my plantation I now Dwell on so him and his heirs
for ever only I give my Loving wife the Lower half with the Dwelling house I now live in during her
Natural life and the half of the out houses Likewise I give to my Son Matthew my Land which
lies on the head of my Brother Thomas Branch & Sons to my Brother James Commonly called
Verlades I also give him a piece of Land Joining to John Blackmans land which he bought
of Mr. John Cullit and see to Grindells run to him and his heirs for ever only my wife to have &
