In the Name of God Amen the 14 day of April in the Year of our Lord God 1732: Elizabeth Bevil of Henrico County and Parish of Bristol
 being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body
 and knowing that it is appointed for all Men unto to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say Principally
 and first of all I give and bequeath my Soul into the hands of God that gave it and my body I commend it to the Earth to be buried
 in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall
 receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as to nothing both Worldly Estate & otherwise it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
 I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. After my Debts and paid.
 I have I give unto my son Peter two hundred acres of land of my Survey lying & bounding upon my two sons Sams & Daniel and
 one hundred ~~acres~~ I give to my son Thomas and One hundred I give to my son Daniel beginning upon the said which was left them by
 their father to them and to their heirs for ever. I have I give to my son Thomas my prospect Arms which was his fathers and also four plates
 plates and four knives and two puter dishes. I have I give to my son Daniel four puter plates and four knives and two puter dishes and one dozen of
 puter spoons. I have I give to my son Peter four puter plates & four knives and one puter dish and one table cloth and one dozen of spoons.
 I have I give to my son Daniel and my feather bed and bolster and covering which I lay on and one large brass kettle and one chest which stands under the
 Window in the kitchen Room.

I have I give to my son Eliza my new feather bed bolster and covering and one deal skin Trunk standing in the inward Room and one Couch and one Iron Pot containing nine gallons with one pair of Pothook and pot Rack Iron and two Lamps and an equal part of his father's Tools. I have I give to my son Daniel one Table and one Couch frame I have I give to my son Thomas one feather bed bolster and covering that is out at Sappony and one Chest that is there also one feather bed with a new tick and one Iron Pot containing between three or four gallons and one Couch frame and one dozen of puter Spoons I have I give to my Daughter Amy one large Chest and one Chest and one dozen puter Spoons I have I give to my Grand Daughter Eliz. Burton one red leather Trunk I have I give to my Daughter Mary Burton my Side Saddle and Bridle providing that she will pay her other two Sisters Eliz. & Amy ten shillings apiece out of it or to either of them that will I have I give to my son Thomas my Iron Grey Horse I have I give to my son Daniel my Bay Horse I have I give to my son Eliza my black Mare and her increase I have I give to my son Eliza my plantation which I now live upon with all the Lands belonging to it which is one hundred acres more or less lying and bounding upon the Old Town Creek to him and to his heirs for ever I have I give to any of my Children my last Entry of Land lying upon Beaver pond in Prince Georges County on the South side of Appomattox River that will pay the Charges and first sell it to the best advantage and the proceeds to be equally divided between my three sons Thomas and Daniel and Eliza and also all the Old puter to be equally divided amongst my Children by two men I have I give to either of my Children one silver Trunk providing they will pay to every one of their brothers and sisters their equal part I have I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Puckerson one young staff or pay to my Executors fifteen shillings I have I give to my Daughter Mary Burton my Shift which I have now on and all my Wearing Robes to be equally divided among my Daughters I have I give to my three sons Thomas Daniel and Eliza all the rest of my Estate to be equally divided amongst them and my son Daniel to take care of Brother Eliza till he comes to the Age of twenty and one year I have I likewise bequeath and ordain my three sons Thomas Daniel and Eliza my only and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament and I so hereby utterly disallow revoke and annul and every other former Testament Wills or Legacies in any case before this time confirming this to be my last Will and Testament in Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year above Written.

Also my Will and mind is the said last Testament mentioned viz. the said Lands upon near the Old Creek in Henrico County be sold to him that gives most money for it and that what money it will procure more then what will pay all my Lawfull Debts, which I order to be paid out of the price of this said Lands may be equally divided among all my Children. and I order that this Will made last night may stand in all other respects except the alteration now made. I desire my exec of the main Will to see this alteration put in Execution as Witnes my hand & Seal this 15th day of April 1732

 Prince Georges County on the South side of Appomattox River that will pay the Charges and first sell it to the best advantage and the
