In the name of God Amen the 1st day of April in the year of our Lord 1732. Elizabeth Bevil of Hants County and Parish of Bristol
being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body
and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die so made and ordained this my last will and testament that is to say principally
and first of all I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my body I command it to the Earth to be buried
in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall re-
ceive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherein it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form after my debts are paid.

I have I give unto my son Edw. two hundred acres of land of my Survey lying & bounding upon my two sons Land Thomas & Daniel and
one hundred acres I give to my son Thomas and one hundred I give to my son Daniel laying upon their Lands which was left them by
their Father to them and to their Heirs forever. I have I give to my son Thomas my Coopers Arms which was his Fathers and also four plates
plates and four Napkins and two Pewter Dishes. I have I give to my son Daniel four Pewter plates and four Napkins and two Pewter dishes and one dozen of
Pewter Spoons. I have I give to my son Edw. four Pewter plates & four Napkins and one Pewter dish and a Table Cloth and one dozen of Spoons.
I have I give to my son Daniel a New feather bed and bolster and covering which lay on one large brick Kettle and one Chest which stands under the
Window in the aforesaid Roomes.

Item

I have I give to my son Eliza my two feather bed bolster and covering and one seal skin trunk standing in the inward Roome and one bath and one iron pot
 containing nine gallons with one pair of pothook and pot hook iron and two lynes and an equal part of his fathers Tools. I have I give to my
 Son Daniel one Table and one bath fram I have I give to my son Thomas one feather bed bolster and covering that is out at Dappony and one chest
 that is there also one feather bed with a musket and one Iron pot containing between three or four gallons and one bath fram and one
 dozen of plates spoons I have I give to my daughter any one large Chest and a dozen plates spoons I have I give to my Grand
 Daughter Eliz Burton one red leather trunk I have I give to my daughter Mary Burton my five books and birds providing that she will
 pay her other two Sisters Eliz. & Amy ten shillings apiece out of it or to either of them that will I have I give to my son Thomas my
 gray horse I have I give to my son Daniel my Bay Horse I have I give to my son Eliza my black Mare and her increase I have I give to my
 son Eliza my plantation which I now live upon with all the land belonging to it which is one hundred acres more or less lying and bounding upon
 the Old Cown Creek to him and to his Heirs for ever I have I give to any of my Children my last Catty of Land lying upon Beaver pond in
 Prince George County on the South side of Appomattox River that will pay the charges and if not sell it to the best advantage and the
 produce to be equally divided between my three Sons Thomas and Daniel and Eliza and also all the old Peter to be equally divided amongst my
 Children by two men I have I give to either of my Children one Silver Tumbler providing they will pay to every one of their brothers and sisters
 their equal part I have I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Purkerson one Young H. F. or pay to my Executors fifteen shillings I have I give to
 my Daughter Mary Burton my shirt which I have worn and all my Wearing clothes to be equally divided among my Daughters
 I have I give to my three Sons Thomas and Daniel and Eliza all the rest of my Estates to be equally divided amongst them and my Son Daniel
 to take care of Brother Eliza till he comes to the age of twenty and over years I have I likewise bequeath and ordain my three Sons
 Thomas Daniel and Eliza my only and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revok
 and annul and every other former Testament Wills or legacys in any wise before this time confirming this to be my last Will
 and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year above written
 signed sealed and delivered in the present state of us

An alteration of our Articles in Elizabeth Bevils Will and Testament made last night.

I Elizabeth Bevil being sick of body but sound in memory and dispositt having made a Will and Testament last night in which I have
 given and bequeathed to my Son Eliza some lands near Dappony in the Woods upon Appomattox River and besides the said Lands give
 him and his Heirs the plantation I now live upon near the Old Cown Creek Now my Will and Testament is the said last Will mentioned
 viz. that I now live upon near the Old Creek in Henrico County be sold to him that gives most money for it and that what money it will
 procure more then what will pay all my lawfull debts, which I order to be paid out of the price of this land may be equally divided
 among all my Children and I order that the Will made last night may stand in all other respects except the alteration now made. I do further
 my last Will to be this alteration put in Execution as witness my hand & Seal this 15th day of April 1782
