This Indenture made the Thirtieth Day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Thirty six Between Thomas Hunter of the parish and County of Henrico of the one part and George Chambers of the parish and County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Hunter friend in consideration of thirty Six pounds current of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said George Chambers his receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath given granted Bargain and Sale Aliened exchanged and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant Bargain and Sale Aliened exchanged and confirmed unto the said George Chambers his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of land containing three hundred and Sixty acres, Situate lying and being in the parish and County of Henrico Between two branches of Chuckahoe Creek called Havings Branch and Poole Branch and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a lower white Oak on Havings Branch and running thence North forty five Degrees West two hundred poles to a former Red Oak on the said Havings Branch thence down the said Branch the several angles thereof to the value of two hundred fifty six poles to a marker w^t oak near the said Havings Branch on the south side thence South forty two Degrees East Twenty poles to a former pine thence South two less Degrees West Sixty two poles to a lower limb white Oak thence South Sevenly two less Degrees East
