mind & Memory do by this present dispose of my worldly Estate in Manner & for use following
in presence. Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughters Elisabeth Allen one father and
furniture which is called my bed to her and her heirs for ever. Item I give unto my Daughter
Mary Mosie one Guinea. Item I give unto my Daughter Sarah Allen one father bed
which stands in the upper Chamber next to the partition do to her & her heirs for ever. Item
I give unto my Daughter Honah Ragland one Negro boy to George to him & her heirs for ever.

Now I give unto my daughter Tabitha Mores one Negro woman called Best one bed & forthwith
 stands in the looms house and one kunk to live & live here for ever. Now I give unto my daughter
 Lullia Stoker one new feather bed & one new kunk which she hath already in her possession & give
 shall give out money to live & live here for ever. Now I give unto my son Henry Walker two Cow &
 Calves and five pounds give out money to be paid him at the end of twelve months after my decease
 to him & his heirs for ever. Now I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son Joel Walker all
 the Remainder and Residue of my Estate both Real and Personal be it of what nature or kind
 I love to him and to his heirs for ever Whom I also constitute authorize and appoint whole sole
 Executor of this my last will & testament Revoking and disannulling all other Wills whatsoever by
 me heretofore made in Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16 day of June 1726

This Indenture made this 3 day of June anno Domini 1728 between on the one part Mosely son of
 the County of Henrico of the one part and William Worsham Junr of the same County of the other part
 Witnesseth that the said Mosely for and in consideration of the sum of seven pounds ten shillings
 Give out money to him in hand paid by the said William Worsham the sum of seven pounds ten shillings
 and himself fully satisfied and paid hath bargained and sold and doth by the present bargain
 sell unto him the said William Worsham his heirs Exrs and Assigns one half acre of the land in
 the Town of Burmundait being the fourth lot and bounds as follows: Beginning at a stake and
 running West a Quarter South twenty poles to another stake thence South and by West four poles to
 another stake thence East a Quarter North twenty poles to another stake thence North by East four poles
 to the place begun at for the said half acre of land with all its rights members &
 Jurisdiction and appurtenances whatsoever unto him the said William Worsham his heirs Exrs
 and Assigns for ever in as large and ample manner as if he had purchased it of the proper in
 full without any let hindrance or delay
