mind & memory do by this present instrument dispose of my worldly Estate in manner for me following
in promos. Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Elisabeth Allen one feather and
furniture which is called my bed to her and her heirs forever. Item I give unto my Daughter
Mary Mose one guinea. Item I give unto my Daughter Sarah Allen one feather bed of
which stands in the upper Chamber Next to the partition door to her heirs forever. Item
I give unto my Daughter Hannah Ragland one Negro boy to her or to her heirs forever.

Item I give unto my daughter Tabitha Moree one Negroe woman call'd Bess one bed & which stands in the looms house and one trunk to her & her heirs for ever. Item I give unto my daughter Willia Stoker one New feather bed & one new trunk which she hath alreadie in her possession & five shillings current money to her & her heirs for ever. Item I give unto my son Henry Walker two Cwre Chars and five pounds current money to be paid him at the end of twelve months after my decease to him & his heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Well Beloved Son Dorell Walker all the remainder and residue of my Estate both Real and Personal be it of what nature or kind soever to him and to his heirs for ever. Whom I also constitute authorise and empower whole sole Executrix of this my last will & testament revoking and disannulling all other wills whatsoever by me heretofore made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16 day of June 1726/

This Indenture made this 3 day of June anno Domini 1728 between Arthur Mosely Son of the County of Hunter of the one part and William Worsham Junr. of the same County of the other part Witnesse that the said Arthur Mosely for and in Consideration of the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings current money to him in hand paid by the said William Worsham the receipt whereof he doth acknowledge and himself fully satisfied and paid hath bargained and sold and doth by these presents bargain & sell unto him the said William Worsham his heirs &c a tract and also quo one half acre of land in the Town of Bermuda it being the fourth lot and bounded as follows Beginning at a stake and running West a quarter South twenty poles to another stake then South and by West four poles to another stake then East a quarter North twenty poles to another stake then North by East four poles to the place begun at first acre and so round the said half acre of land with all its rights members & Jurisdictions and appurtenances whatsoever unto him the said William Worsham his heirs &c Adm't and Abights for ever in as large and ample manner as if he had purchased it of the freeholders in full and without any hindrance or delay.
