by my Bar: and to be Distributed among my two Daughters when they shall respectively arrive to the age of fourteen and twenty years  
or marry and further my will is that the Negroes above directed and appointed to be employ'd at my Metopock plantation  
whos names are here inserted, viz. Casar, Milo, Scipio, Hove, Pompey, Jehus, Sampson, Sammy, Syrus, Town and Bunahie and  
her executors after my son Richard shall obtain the age of one and twenty years shall be equally divided between him and my son  
William and that as many of the several Stocks of Cattle, Hogs, Horses and Sheep both at home and the said plantations  
at Metopock be apply'd to the Maintenance of my four Children, viz. Anne Epps, Martha Epps, Richard Epps and  
William Epps as my said Executors shall think necessary, and if the Stock either of Hogs, Sheep, horses or Cattle  
should be thought by my said Executors to be too great at any of the said plantations then my will and desire is that he  
or she more than necessary for the Maintenance of my said Children and if any of the  
said Stocks by publick outcry and that the Money arising by such Sale shall be equally  
divided between them when they respectively attain the age of one and twenty years

I do give devise and bequeath unto my wife Sarah Eppes my Christ and house wares belonging heron by the names of the Station  
 Dimond God and Spark Item I give and bequeath unto my said wife the remainder of the Term of Silver Sides I have yet to come of my  
 man Servant Frank. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Francis Eppes all the Stock of Horses Hogs, Sheep and Cattle I have at my  
 plantation call'd Long Field. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Richard Eppes one Silver Can known by the name of the ma  
 Can and one Dozen Silver Spoons Item I give and devise to my son William Eppes one other Silver Can known by the name of the  
 Old Can and one Dozen of Silver Spoons. Item I will and Devise the Tuition and Guardianship of my two Sons Richard Eppes and  
 William Eppes untill they shall respectively attain the Age of one and Twenty years and of my Daughters Anne Eppes and  
 Martha Eppes untill they shall respectively attain the Age of one and Twenty years or marry which shall first happen unto my wife  
 Sarah Eppes and my son Francis Eppes. Item I give unto my son Francis Eppes one fine Damask Table Cloth and Dozen of fine  
 Napkins one Dozen of Russia Leather Chairs and one large Chair of Traus. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Richard Eppes  
 one Walnut bedstead now standing in the Hall and Dozen Russia Leather Chairs and one fine Damask Table Cloth. Item I give  
 and bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Eppes one Russia Leather Trunk marked with A.E. Item I give and bequeath unto  
 my Daughter Martha Eppes one Trunk marked S.E. Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Eppes one Chair of  
 Traus and one Dozen of bain Chairs. Item my Will and Desire is that there be no appointment of my Estate lastly I do hereby nominate constitute  
 and appoint my wife Sarah Eppes and my son Francis Eppes Executors of this my last Will. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand

 confirm with the said Joseph Mayo and his heirs forever all that Tract of Land which in the said Edmund now lives contain
