and Testament in Manner and form following In witness I commit my Soul to God who giveth
and remitt my Body unto the Earth by decent Burying at the Direction of my executors hereinafter named
After named sincerely trusting in the Mercy of Christ Jesus my Redeemer fullernal salvation at the
Day of his Resurrection and entrelling my Heirely Estate with what it shall please God to bestow upon me,
I give and bequeath this same, as followeth And I give Wife and Bequests all my Land in Barrood Hundred
to my dear and loving Mother during her Natural life, with all houses and orchards thereunto belonging
and after her deceas to my loving Brother Richard Lppes and his heirs forever, On condition my said Brother
Richard Lppes & shall let my Brother William Lppes live in & peaceably and quietly enjoy all that
tract of land lying in Henrico County and parish known by the Name of Longfield and now in my possession
which was given to me by my father, but if my Brother Richard Lppes his heirs shall at any time molest or infest
my Brother William Lppes in his & of their quiet possession of any part of Longfield then I give that land which
belonged to Thomas Jones wher my father purchased and demised of this land in Barrood Hundred
to my Brother William Lppes and his heirs forever And I give Wife and Bequests to my loving Brother William
Lppes all my land at Longfield and that which was purchased of Robert Brudenell also one half of my land at this
Quarter to have the plantation now located in his part to him and his heirs for ever Item I give Wife and
Bequests to my loving Brother Richard Lppes the other half of my land at this Quarter to be divided
equally in quantity and quality to him and his heirs forever And I give Wife and Bequests to my
loving brother Lppes our Negro Boy Tom, our Negro girl named Hannah, also one hundred and fifty
= pounds

pounds per cent Money and one half of Drawers to her and her heirs forever. How I give and Bequeath to my wife for Martha
 Eppes two Negresses named Keto and Betty also one hundred Quarters pounds current Money and One lot of Silver plates to her and her
 heirs forever. Item my self and wife is that the said Negroes be confined at his several plantations where they now reside and that
 his wife by their labour after his Maintenance towards raising the Money given us by herself. My will is that the Negro Tom, Nancy
 Keto, George, Rachell, Harry, Phoebe and Tush remain at his quarter, pony and Abram at the Mountain tractable
 York, Betty and Pollard Longfield. How I give of wife and Bequeath the above named Negroes living at his quarter, the Mountain and
 Longfield and his heirs to be equally Divided between my Brother Richard and William Eppes and their heirs forever. How I
 give of wife and Bequeath to my son in law John Royal my Negro Man Name Jack to him and his heirs forever. How I give of wife and Bequeath
 to my dear and loving Mother my Negro Mary Langston, Tim, Dick, Charles, George and my Negro boy Working to her and her heirs forever
 also two other Beds and furniture which my father gave me. How I give of wife and Bequeath to my loving Brother Richard Eppes my silver
 Silver Tankard, my Silver gilted Spoon, my Trooping saddle and furniture. How I give of wife and Bequeath to my loving Brother William Eppes
 my Scruton with glass of glass also our New Trooping saddle and furniture. How I give of wife and Bequeath to Capt. Charles Adlens if he comes
 to Virginia my young horse and two guineas to buy him a Mourning Ring. How I give of wife and Bequeath to my Brothers Richard and
 William my land in equal and County near the Mountains to be Divided equally between them, them and their heirs forever. How my
 Will and Dese is that my plate be appraised. How I give of wife and Bequeath all the rest of my plate to my dear and loving Mother
 Sarah Eppes without delay. Nominal, justly and affix my signature after my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fourth Day of January in the year of our Lord thousand seven hundred and thirty six
