

In the name of god amen I George Freeman of y^e parish and County of Henrico do make this my last Will and Testament as followeth (viz^t) first I bequeath my Soule to god and my Body to be buried and all my worldly Debt to be justely paid. Item I give and bequeath one certain Tract of Land which I hold under several Surveys amounting to one Thousand Six hundred and eight Acres to be Divided and distribute in manner and form as followeth and the said Tract of Land ulging and being in y^e parish and County of Henrico where I now live. Item I leave to my Daughter Ellis Freeman during her Natural life one certain parcel of the above named Tract of Land beginning on Buck Meadow in Randolph line thence up the said Meadow and continuing the same Eas^t untill it meet my back line the said Tract or parcel of Land containing by Estimation one hundred Acres or be there more or less to her my said Daughter during her Natural life and afterwards to the heirs of her Body lawfully begotten and if she should Die without Issue the said Land to be to my Son Joseph his heirs or assigns. Item I give unto my Son George Freeman one certain parcel of the aforesaid Tract of Land containing by Estimation three hundred Acres or be there more or less beginning on Buck Meadow and running thence a straight Course to the mouth of Scraping Branch sou^t the said Branch untill it meet my back line to him my said Son George his heirs or assigns. Item I give to my Son John Freeman one certain parcel of the said Tract of Land containing by Estimation Two hundred Acres or be there more or less beginning on the East Side the flat Branch at the place where George line crosses the said Branch thence down the said Branch to Randolph line and so including all y^e offing & Survey to him my Son John his heirs or assigns. Item I give to my Son Joseph Freeman the plantation and whereon I now live with all the remaining part of my old Survey of Land to him my Son Joseph his heirs or assigns. Item I leave one hundred Acres of Land whereon John Shoemaker now lives to be finally made over unto the said Shoemaker by Deed of Sale by my Executor. Item I give unto my Son in law Thomas Sptin and his Wife my Daughter Hannah Sptin one certain parcel of y^e said Tract of Land beginning on John Shoemaker line after his land is laid off and running thence along Thomadell line and thence about half a mile to Deep Run thence down the said Run to Randolph line to them my Son in law and Daughter during their Natural lives and after their Deaths to my Grandson James Sptin Son to the said Thomas and Hannah Sptin to him his heirs or assigns. Item I give to my Son Holman Freeman all the remainder of my aforesaid Tract of Land to him his heirs or assigns. Item I give to my Son George Freeman a young Negro named Will to him his heirs or assigns. Item I give to my Son Holman Freeman a Negro boy named Lewis to him his heirs or assigns. Item I leave to my Daughter Ellis Freeman a Negro Girl named Nan to her and her heirs. Item I leave to my Son in law Thomas Sptin and my Daughter Hannah Sptin a Negro girl named Sady to them during their lives and afterwards to the heirs of her Body lawfully begotten. Item I give to my loving Wife Jane Freeman one Negro man named Tom and a Negro Girl named Phely to her during her Natural life and afterwards what is after her Decese I give and bequeath the said Negro man named Tom to my Son John Freeman his heirs or assigns and I give and bequeath the said Negro Girl named Phely to my Son Joseph Freeman his heirs or assigns. Item I give and bequeath to my four Sons namely George Holman John and Joseph and my two Daughters Hannah and Ellis each of them Two Cows and Calves & Two Swine and piggs. Item I give and bequeath all y^e rest of my estate in what manner and form I sever it to unto my loving Wife Jane Freeman and I do appoint my said Wife and my Son George Freeman and my Son Holman Freeman jointly Executors of this my last Will and Testament.  all the remaining part of my Survey of Land to him my son Joseph his heirs or assigns. Item I leave one hundred
 Acres of Land whereon John Shoemaker now lives to be firmly made over unto the said Shoemaker by Deed of Sale by my
 Executors. Item I give unto my son in law Thomas Spten and his Wife my Daughter Hannah Spten one certain parcel of
 said Tract of Land beginning on John Shoemaker's line after his land is laid off and running thence along Thomadell's
 line thence southerly to Deaplans thence down the said Run to Randolphs line to them my son in law and
 daughter during their Natural lives and after their Deaths to my Grandson James Spten son to the said Thomas
 and Hannah Spten to him his heirs or assigns. Item I give to my son Holman Freeman all the remainder of my
 aforesaid Tract of Land to him his heirs or assigns. Item I give to my son George Freeman a young Negro named Will
 to him his heirs or assigns. Item I give to my son Holman Freeman a Negro boy named Lewis to him his heirs or assigns. Item

 Thomas Spten and my Daughter Hannah Spten a Negro girl named Judy to them during their lives and afterwards
 to the heirs of her Body lawfully begotten.
 Item I give to my loving Wife Sarah Freeman one Negro man named Tom and a Negro Girl named Phely to her
 during her Natural life and afterwards what is after her Decese I give and bequeath the said Negro man named
 Tom to my son John Freeman his heirs or assigns and I give and bequeath the said Negro Girl named Phely to my son
 Joseph Freeman his heirs or assigns. Item I give and bequeath to my four sons Namely George Holman John and
 Joseph and my two Daughters Hannah and Ellis each of them Two Cows and Calves Two Swine and piggs. Item I
 give and bequeath all of my worldly estate in what manner and form I sever it to unto my loving Wife Sarah Freeman and
 I do appoint my said Wife and my son George Freeman and my son Holman Freeman jointly Executors of this my
