In the Name of God Amen I Gilley Mason of Henrico being in Perfect Sense (God be praised) do make this my Last Will & Testament as Followeth I Impairies I Will that all the Children belong to a Wench Named Hannah which I Purched of Thomas Cardwell both what she has or may have together with Lucy, Jane & Ned. also that the Wenchs Children both what they have or may have each & every one of them During there Natural Lives When each of my sons comes to the age of Twenty to have an Equal Part of thos Negroes both in Quantity &

I Give & my Daughters to receive an Equal Part of the Negroes at the Age of Seventeen And if the Child my wife now goes with should be a Son my Will is he shall have an Equal Part with my Sons. I Give & bequeath to my son Witt-hire One Hundred Pound Current money at the Age of Twenty & the same sum to the Child my wife goes with if it proves a Son a Hundred Pound Each Each of Children to have one Horse and Saddle wort Tenn Pound Each Five Cows of Calves. I Give and bequeath to my Loving wife During her Natural Life Six Working Negroes Viz Jack, Robin, Bob, Temp, Sam & Bidd. I Lend to Thom as farwell & his wife Marthew one Negro & Wench Nam'd Hannah during A re Natural Lives and then to return to my wife Mary and at my Wives Deceas The Negroes with all the rest of my Estate to be Equally Divided among all my Children and if any one or more of my Children should die Under Age it is my Will their Part or parts shall be Equally Divided among the Rest. I do appoint my wife Mary whole and Sole executrix. IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 28 Janu 1746/47.
