all the Cattle as I have not in this my will Disposed of & all
the Hogs belonging unto me may be sold at outcry in Order
to discharge my just Debts after the necessary Provision for
my Family is made out of them. Item I give my beloved son
Joseph Royall one Shilling Sterling money. I also appoint
my beloved wife Mary Royall & my beloved Sons William & John
Royall Executors of this my last will and Testament, as Witness
my hand and Seal this Nineteenth day of December One thousand
Seven Hundred and forty Six
