 Cannon one black mare brandes. S. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Jane the life of Samuel pine ham  
 one Shilling Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary the life of John Cannon one Shilling  
 Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah one young black Horse unbranded, Lastly I give unto  
 my loving Wife Mary all the rest residue and remainder of my said personal Estate of what kind soever the  
 same during her Widowhood but in case she should happen to marry then it is my Will and mind that the said  
 Estate so given to her as abovesaid shall be equally distributed among my said three Children John William  
 and Sarah and lastly I do hereby appoint my said loving Wife John pine and Abraham Childers Executors of  
 this my last Will and Testament hoping they will faithfully and duly performed as my Trust in them is reposed  
 In witness whereof I have hereunto this my last Will and Testament set my hand and seal this fifth day of January  
 one Thousand Seven hundred Thirty and Two.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hitchens one pig Cow and all her increase to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my grandson Richardson Cox one hundred and five Acres of Land where my Son Richard Cox now liveth by virtue of a Will. Item I give to him the said Richardson and his heirs forever. Item I give bequeath to my Son Richard Cox one Shilling Sterling. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth for her one Shilling. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Beth Wattle my Book and Spectacles. Item I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Mary Cox all my Hogs and Sheep and my mare Bessie and saddle and all rest of my Estate and last by constitute and appoint my loving Wife Mary Cox my Wife and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament. I annuallize and make void all other Wills heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my seal this 13 day of July 1734. I also give to my said Wife Mary my Negro man Saml during his Life and then to return to my Son John Cox.
