and perfecte sente and memory praised be god do make & ordaine this my last will and Testament in
manner & form following viz I bequeath my soul to god that gave it me hoping through the merits of my
blessed Saviour and redeemer Jesus Christe receive full pardon of all my sins & a full resurrection
to eternal bliss & happiness & my body to the earth to be decently buried according to the direction
of my Executrix hereafter named and my real & personal effects after my just debts paid I give &
Dispose of the same as followeth viz I give & bequeath unto my son John Baugh one half or moiety
of all my lands & the plantation on piers & the Creek & his heirs for ever except forty acres. I give
and bequeath unto my son Henry Baugh and his heirs for ever the other half or moiety of all my lands
and the plantation there living upon, upon the river except forty acres. and if it should please god that
one of my s^r sons should die w^t out lawfull heirs then such part of the said land to return to the sur-
viving brother and his heirs for ever & for want of such heirs all my s^r lands to return and belong
two Daughters Mary & Hannah Baugh & their heirs for ever. I give unto my son John Baugh
one sealed Ring one Gunn and one set of Silver buttons marked J B. I give unto my son Henry
one Gunn. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann, and to my Daughter Martha, and to my
Daughter Sarah to each of them one Shilling, they having already rec^d their portions. I give and
bequeath unto my Daughter Mary the wife of Henry Walters one Cow & Calf. I give and bequeath
to my Daughter Hannah one Cow and Calf. I give & bequeath all the rest of my effects to my loving w^t
Margrett and to her Disposessing viz Lands goods Chatter & all whatsoever shall be mine and does
hersby make & Constitute my s^r wife my whole & sole Execut^r of this my last will in witness where-
of I have hereunto putt my hand & seal this fourt^h day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand
and seven hundred and fourteen.
